Dear Sisters and Brothers,

I have to tell you, it has been one of those months. Last month's Visitor was focused on the gift of mentors, colleagues and others who walked (and continue to do so) in my faith journey. I reminded us that as we walked with Michaelo, we too would be counted as one of those important partners in his life's journey. I still believe we are and will continue to be, maybe just not in the way we envisioned.

People have asked about Michaelo, our intern program and what his leaving might mean for us as an intern site. I will speak to what I know. Wartburg believes us to be a VERY good internship site. Part of this has to do with their knowing Sally and I, part has to do with the nature of our congregation's involvement in the larger church and part of it, is believing that we are a wonderful place for interns to grow and learn. Thus, we will continue to be seen as a place where Wartburg will want to place future interns.

What I do not know, and I have said before, is whether or not we will get an intern next summer. The process unfolds like this. Intern sites apply in January, matches are made in February, interns are informed of the match early in March and are given a week to consider whether the match is a good one. If they agree, the congregation is then informed mid-March. Once the matches are made and agreed upon, most interns begin sometime in June/July. One question that has been asked is would we get another intern this summer. The answer is no. All Interns have been assigned and are in place.

Below you will find a letter from Michaelo that he emailed to me while I was on vacation. It is a reminder that while he may not be physically here, he is part of our story, our journey; and we, a part of his. I ask that you continue to keep him in your prayers as well as his candidacy committee and the seminary community.



- You are responsible for your pet at all times. Please have clean-up bags with you (just in case...).

One blunt scissors

Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers

Five black or blue ballpoint pens

One box of 16 or 24 crayons

One 2 ½ inch eraser



Personal care kit supplies

One bath-size towel Two bath-size bars of wrapped soap

One adult-size toothbrush in its original wrapping or sealed in a business size envelope
One sturdy comb

One metal nail clipper



Baby care kit supplies

Two cotton/cotton-blend t-shirts
Two gowns or sleepers w/o feet
Two receiving blankets
Four cloth diapers
One hand towel, dark color
One sweater, sweatshirt, or
jacket with a hood, or include
a baby cap
Two pairs of baby socks
Two bath-size bars of gentle soap
in its original wrapping
Two diaper pins or large safety
pins

Sizes up to 24 months may be used. Consider varying the sizes of the clothing items so the layette will continue to be useful as the baby grows. Gently used, clean items may be substituted for new ones.



Fabric kit supplies

Two pieces of cotton or cottonblend fabric, cut into pieces measuring:

2 ¼ yards of 60" wide, **OR**3 yards of 44" wide, **OR**4 yards of 36" wide fabric
Two spools of matching **OR**neutral-colored general purpose thread, 250-300 yards each
