Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Ash Wednesday is March 1st. Lent is fast approaching! This year our theme will be 'Scripture's Impact: Bible Stories and How They Shape Us.' It will be a time of reflection on scripture and its impact on our preachers and our congregation. Each Wednesday you will hear a sermon based on one of our' favorite scripture texts. 'Our' means Sally, Halcyon and myself. We will preach on scripture lessons that have significantly impacted and shaped our lives. During Lent we will also invite you to share some of your favorite scripture lessons and why they mean so much to you. With your permission we will share these scriptures and your thoughts through our webpage and Facebook pages. Now, you may wonder, "Why this theme AND why share my story?" Let me explain.

Martin Luther struggled with what it meant to be a person of faith. As he searched the Bible he ran across various scripture lessons (Romans 1:17 and Habakkuk 2:4) that helped him understand God's forgiveness was not something that could not be earned, rather it was a gift. These scriptures along with others freed

him to see God in a way he had never seen before. It opened his eyes to God's mercy and love, and shaped him into a new person. Part of that transformation resulted in the 95 Theses.

While Luther was writing, another new thing was breaking forth; the printing press. This allowed his work to be printed in mass and distributed far faster than the current technology of hand copying would allow. These two moments in time, Luther's personal insights coupled with a new communication technology, combined to begin the Reformation on Oct 31, 1517. This year we celebrate its 500th birthday.

So there you have it. We will share in sermon, our favorite scriptures and the impact they have had on our lives. I ask that you do the same. Pick a scripture that has meaning to you and then write a few lines about why. I believe that sharing your stories with our new technologies will be a gift to people you cannot imagine.

March 1 is Ash Wednesday (Ecumenical Service). March 8, 15, 22, 29 and April 5 at 1pm and 6:30pm, will be our 25-30 minute Wednesday Lenten services. April 13 is Maundy Thursday and April 14 is Good Friday (Ecumenical Service). Both will be at 1pm and 6:30pm. April 16 is Easter with services at 6:30am, 8am and 10:30am. Please join us as we journey through Lent to Easter.



Giving By Text

Do you want to give an offering to St. John's using your cell phone? If so, simply send a text to **608-709-0944** with the amount you would like to contribute. Make sure to include the dollar sign before the amount. Example: \$25. If this is your first time, within a few minutes, you'll be sent a text with a link to register. Click on the link and enter your cardholder name and credit or debit card information. Once your registration is complete, you will receive a text verification and a receipt via email. For future giving, simply send a text with the amount you wish to give, and it will process automatically!

The default setting for giving is our General Fund. If you wish to contribute to another fund, add the name of the fund after your giving amount. Example: \$25 Building. Other funds we have are: Benevolence, Water, Thankoffering and World Hunger. The Water fund is helping build a well through the ELCA World Hunger program. The Thankoffering fund is helping support ministries through the Women of the ELCA.

Fees for texting are:

\$.50 one time set up fee per account

\$.38 per transaction cost

Credit card expense of 2.65% charge per transaction for most credit cards OR 3.5% charge if card is American Express.
