

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

By the time you read this, our Intern Derek Rosenstiel will have been at St. John's for nearly three weeks. He will have preached his first sermon, been installed and led worship. He will also be preparing, along with Becky, to welcome a baby.

For those of you who are parents, you may remember (or are in the midst of) all the newness that comes with welcoming a new person into the world. For many of you parental leave was a gift you received from your work that allowed you time to make this transition.

Our ELCA Synodical guidelines, which help congregations at joyous times like this, state that rostered leaders are to receive six weeks of maternal/paternal leave after the birth of a child. St. John's personal guidelines related to paternal/maternal leave are modeled after the synod guidelines and state the same leave is to be granted.

This is all to say that after the birth of their child, Derek will be on leave for up to six weeks.

We are excited to be a congregation who gets to welcome a new child into our midst. On average Sally and I get the chance to hold and pray for nearly 20 babies a year. We look forward to holding Derek and Becky's child in September (they are due September 6<sup>th</sup>).

During Derek's absence, if you wish to send a card, you can send it to the parsonage, 75 First Street, Prairie du Sac. I know they already appreciate your welcome and I know that your continued support during this time of transition will be a great gift to them.

Internship is a special time where students prepare to serve as a pastor in the ELCA. It is a time of growth and challenge, a time to experience new things, work through unexpected situations and grow in the capacity to be a disciple of Christ, called to serve both a congregation and the larger church. ## **School Kit Supplies**

We are asking for your help in gathering supplies for our School Kits again this year. The kits are sent to Lutheran World Relief each fall.

Each kit needs:

Four 70-sheet notebooks

**One** 30 cm. ruler (or one with inches and cms.)

One pencil sharpener

One blunt scissors

Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers

Five black or blue ballpoint pens

One box of 16 or 24 crayons

One 2 ½ inch eraser

## Personal care kit supplies

One bath-size towel (not longer than 48" please)
Two bath-size bars of wrapped soap
One adult-size toothbrush in its original wrapping
or sealed in a business size envelope
One sturdy comb
One metal nail clipper

## Fabric kit supplies

Two pieces of cotton or cottonblend fabric, cut into pieces measuring:

2 1/4 yards of 60" wide, OR

3 yards of 44" wide, OR

4 yards of 36" wide fabric

Two spools of matching **OR** 

neutral-colored general purpose thread, 250-300 yards each

#### Baby care kit supplies

Two cotton/cotton-blend t-shirts
Two gowns or sleepers w/o feet
Two receiving blankets
Four cloth diapers
One hand towel, dark color
One sweater, sweatshirt, or
jacket with a hood, or include
a baby cap
Two pairs of baby socks
Two bath-size bars of gentle soap
in its original wrapping
Two diaper pins or large safety pins

Sizes up to 24 months may be used. Consider varying the sizes of the clothing items so the layette will continue to be useful as the baby grows.

Gently used, clean items may be substituted for new ones.
