Dear Sisters and Brothers,

On May 13, nearly 20 young people will profess their faith using the words of the Apostles' Creed. They will then acknowledge the promises their parents and sponsors made at their baptism and in the midst of the community of St. John's Lutheran Church, they will answer the question, "Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism:

- to live among God's faithful people,
- to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper,
- to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed,
- to serve all people, following the example of Jesus,
- and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

Their response, "I do, and I ask God to help and guide me," will be a public affirmation of faith and their declaration to continue their journey with the larger Christian community.

This Lenten season I invite you to join with all of God's people in revisiting the promises made on your behalf in baptism and renewing the promises affirmed again in your Affirmation of Baptism (Confirmation).

Beginning with Ash Wednesday and continuing on through the five Wednesdays of Lent, we will explore what scripture tells us about living out these promises to: Live, Hear, Proclaim, Serve and Strive.

Siblings of Jesus, children of God, join us as we journey from Ash Wednesday, Feb 14, through Easter Sunday, April 1, on the path that our brother Jesus walked, a path he continues to walk with us. This path is challenging, yet life giving. It is full of struggle, yet seeks peace. It calls us to engage evil, yet knows that ultimately all is in God's gracious hands.

May this Lenten season be a time for reflection and action on these promises.



Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

I have been privileged to be in conversation with many of you about how we might stand up in the face of racism and to be a word of hope instead of a word of hatred.

Today I share with you part of a statement made by our Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton (you can read the full statement on the ELCA Facebook page):

"...we should be fostering a world where each of us sees every person – regardless of race, origin, ethnicity, gender or economic status – in the image of God and, therefore, worthy of dignity and respect. Our church has relationships and partnerships with Christians and others on six continents. These are our sisters and brothers. We strive to accompany them and they us, across boundaries and cognizant of our diversity, yet all seeking the common good. In working for a healed, reconciled and just world, we all should faithfully strive to participate in God's reconciling work, which prioritizes disenfranchised, vulnerable and displaced people in our communities and the world, bearing witness – each of us – to the love of God in Jesus Christ."

As your pastors we are committed to follow, and challenge you, to follow God's command to love and serve one another. That includes people who are different from us, who disagree with us, and even those who anger us! The easy part is to serve those we love and who are like us. But God is always pushing us to do things God's way, not our own way, which can be downright hard.

Please join us in our Sunday adult education sessions on Sundays through March as we talk about issues of racism, diversity, sexism, and how we might respond as faithful Christians.

The Gospel of Mark reminds us of the urgency to follow God's command and to bring forth this new reality we have in Christ. That all of God's children are beloved children. And that we don't get to choose which of God's children get to be loved and served.

They're not easy conversations. There are no magic wands that fix the brokenness of our society. But there is always hope in the One who brought ultimate reconciliation.

Greetings Siblings in Christ,

It has been a number of years now since the bullying prevention movement started. This powerful & positive movement is something that most of you have probably heard of in your workplace, in your community, or in school. Maybe you have even attended a seminar or workshop focused on the topic of how to stand up to bullying. This movement has produced such helpful phrases as this: "Be a Buddy Not a Bully", "You Never Look Good Trying to Make Someone Else Look Bad", and "Pulling Someone Down Will Never Help You Reach the Top". Although this idea is something most people are already familiar with, I think it is something that can never be stressed enough.

In environments charged with polarized stances on politics. religion, values and so much more; there is always the possibility for bullying to be encountered. Even without such environments. the presence of random acts of bullving can be seen almost everywhere you look; whether on television, social media or in your immediate surroundings. I personally have experienced bullying firsthand in my childhood as well as in my adult years. In addition, I have witnessed others be bullied throughout my life, in many different settings. The effects of bullying upon everyone involved have been shown to be quite dramatic to say the least. Depression and anxiety, increased feelings of sadness and loneliness, changes in sleep and eating patterns, and loss of interest in activities individuals used to enjoy - are just a few of these effects. Bullying can even drive a person to some drastic measures in certain situations. Individuals who have been bullied may perform acts of self-harm, or may turn to more retaliatory actions such as abuse or seeking revenge through acts of violence. Individuals who are bullies and are never called to account for their actions are more likely to go on to abuse others in the future; either physically, verbally, or even sexually.

For February, I decided to write about this topic because I think an important part of being witnesses to the gospel of Christ is to always be attentive to ways in which we can promote justice and love wherever it may be lacking. I think another phrase promoted by the bullying prevention communities puts it well – "It is not enough to be compassionate, we must speak out and act!" The

coming season of Lent is a time of solemn reflection, repentance of sins & preparation through prayerful self-assessment. I would claim though that Lent is also a season of action where we may more

intentionally practice the living out of our call to seek justice, love mercy, and walk humbly with our Lord. It is my hope and prayer that the Church as a whole and we as members of this Body may continue to promote and be agents of love in the midst of hate.

God in Christ proclaims to the world that all people deserve life, love & the fullest measure of dignity. In the eyes of God we are all beloved children who are beautifully and wonderfully made. Through the movement of the Holy Spirit God declares that no chains can bind us or restrain us from receiving the gifts of grace that are offered to us all in Christ. Let us daily proclaim these truths with our voices, with our actions, and with our whole lives! I pray that you may always be able to see that your most true identity is the precious identity that is given to you in the waters of baptism!
