

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

On Wednesday, March 16, Wartburg Seminary's second year students received the news of where they would spend their third year as an intern. These students had filled out paperwork indicating what kind of site, supervisor, location and learning experience they were hoping to have. A committee of professors and students then worked at making the best matches possible to provide the needed learning for these future pastors. On March 18 sites were informed on who their intern would be. John Evans will be our next intern. Here is some information from John's application:

John grew up in the Southern and Eastern part of the country. He went to Berry College in Mount Berry, GA. He graduated in 2016 with a major in political science and a minor in religion. He is single, lives in Spicer, MN, and is a DL student (Distance Learner) at Wartburg. This means, like some of our past interns (Marlow and Elisabeth) he lives at a distance from Wartburg and uses Zoom to be part of the learning community. John has worked at a number of Bible Camps, including Shetek Lutheran Bible Camp in Slayton, MN, where I was a counselor from 1975-79. He currently is working and living at Green Lake Bible Camp in Spicer, MN.

John will be joining us towards the end of August or early September. This summer he will be completing CPE (clinical pastoral care) which is required for students before beginning internship.

The ELCA and its seminaries see internship as a vital and critical aspect to the training of leaders for the church. We serve as a teaching congregation in partnership with Wartburg Seminary. We give opportunity to students to experience the realities of church leadership through a caring congregation, the oversight of a supportive internship committee (Chair, Nancy Passehl) and the guidance of an experienced and trained supervisor. These elements, combined with a staff gifted in welcoming new interns and helping them experience the full range of ministry opportunities, builds the proficiencies an intern needs to acquire.

Thank you once again for being a teaching congregation, willing to help the larger church through the process we call internship. You are a blessing to the students, congregations and the larger church!

Dear Friends in Christ,

Most of you by now have heard that I will be on sabbatical this summer beginning June 6 - September 6. My focus of study will be on healing from trauma, and I am looking for some feedback from all of you.

Trauma is an emotional response from a terrible event. Most of us have experienced trauma in some way (if not many ways) in our lifetime. We can even be traumatized by watching someone experience a traumatic event! And just as trauma impacts us all in individual ways, healing comes in a variety of ways.

Sometimes healing comes from very structured, professional help that we need to aid us in our healing journey. Sometimes it's less formal and found in a circle of friends or family support. Sometimes it's found in cumulative glimpses of hope through a stranger's story, random acts of kindness, and so on.

Healing can start immediately after a trauma, whether it's tiny steps or big steps. It can happen over years of hard emotional work. It can be stunted and begin decades after experiences.

I would be very interested in hearing from you where you have found healing throughout your lifetime in the midst of and/or after going through a traumatic experience(s). You do not need to share your trauma (but my ears are always open if you would like to). Below are the lists of items needed to complete each kit. If you are able to donate any of these items. please bring them to the marked bins in the fellowship hall.

Newborn Kits:

- 1 bath towel (approx. 52" long) new or gently used
- 1 washcloth (not microfiber) new or gently used
- 1 bath-size bar of white Ivory soap
- 1 newborn cotton t-shirt OR onesie, new/gently used
- 1 newborn stocking hat, new or gently used
- 1 baby receiving blanket, new or gently used
- 2 cloth diapers (very needed)
- 2 diaper pins
- 1 pillowcase

Hospice Kits:

- 1 bath towel (approx. 52" long) new or gently used
- 1 washcloth, new or gently used (not microfiber)
- 1 bath-size bar of Ivory unscented soap
- 1 adult toothbrush
- 1 pick-style comb
- 1 nail clipper, larger size preferred
- 6 Band-Aids
- 1 (4oz) jar or tube of petroleum jelly (very needed)
- 1 pair kitchen gloves, size medium (very needed)
- 1 pillowcase

We will be sending our finished kits to the Synod Assembly on May 6 and May 7. From there a volunteer will transport them to GHM of Minneapolis, MN.

Call to Order/Opening Remarks:

Meeting was called to order at 6:32 p.m. by Janelle Hupp. Janelle asked for approval of the agenda. Motion to approve was made by Nancy and seconded by Gina. Motion carried. A devotion/prayer was then given by Linda Michaels named Puppy Sighs Love.

Secretary Minutes:

The February minutes were submitted online by Cathy Yanke. A motion to approve minutes was made by Marian and seconded by Megan. Motion carried.

- We are in talks for some spring/summer activities that we can plan in the coming weeks and months.

· No new report

Youth member at Large: Jonah Richard reported:

- · Winter sports are wrapping up and Sauk Prairie had several students recently participate at state tournaments:
 - 6 swimmers
 - 3 skiers and snowboarders
 - 1 wrestler
- 15 students will be participating at State Solo & Ensemble competition.

- The Sauk Prairie School District has gone to targeting masking with the drop in COVID cases.
- The Sauk Prairie School District received a \$2.4M Workforce Innovation Grant.
- · High school students going on the 6:8 mission trip to Joplin, MO, had their first meeting on 2/27/22. Students from St. John's going on the trip are myself and Kennedy Colby. Kennedy's mom, Mackenzie, will also be going as one of the adult group leaders. There are still a few more spots available but students need to sign up no later than March 15th.

Executive Comments - Director:

- · Covid-19 transmission rates continue to decline nationwide and within our tri-county area.
- CDC has a new tool that will allow communities real-time access to transmission rates within their Counties on a day-to-day basis. This will be helpful to PPC and other church leaders as we make decisions that will bring us gradually back to worship and church activities as we knew in pre-Covid times. We will be looking, specifically, at our masking policy and whether we can return to traditional communion practices in the coming weeks. As we make positive changes, we will need to stay alert to the possibility of increased transmission rates and be ready to scale back, if needed.
- · As we move closer to spring, I want to offer thanks to the folks on the Properties Committee and others within our congregation who have worked to keep our parking lot and sidewalks clear of snow and ice through the winter months.

Pastor/Intern Reports

Fred's Report:

- · Completed first draft of procedure manual and will send it to the Stewardship committee for their edits/inputs/etc. This manual covers a variety of practices related to how we handle money and other related subjects. Most of our practices are well known to those who are part of the process, but are not written down. This manual is our first step in recording our practices.
- We still have not received any applications for our Youth Director position. We may need to consider how to move forward to put in place certain pieces of this position before the fall of 2022.
- · We have three baptisms scheduled for March and one for May. These will be the first baptisms during worship since covid began.
- · We will hear on March 18 if we will receive an intern for 2022-23.

Sally's Report:

- Education: Received positive feedback from confirmation mentors about Music as Expression of Faith curriculum for February. Teachers enjoyed seeing our students on Zoom. Sunday School students were a blast on Zoom in February! We have great families here. Preparing rooms, volunteers, students, and curriculum for return to the building March 6. Planning in the works for Affirmation of Baptism (April 24 @ 10:30) and Graduation Sunday (May 22 @ 10:30).
- Conference/Continuing Ed: Attending Synod LEAD event on Saturday, Feb 26. Theme is "the complexity of joy in troubled times and how the currencies and gifts of God has given us can nurture this joy."
- Sacraments: Excited to have some baptisms scheduled during worship over the next month or so and celebrating with our First Communion members!
- · Visits: Thank you to Pastor Fred for making the majority of the visits while I've been attending to all the youth director duties. I've been sending notes to folks to stay in touch. Thank you to the Fellowship and Evangelism Boards for working on the baskets. They were very well received!
- · Volunteers Needed: We are looking for volunteers to serve as Sunday School Superintendents, teachers, and helpers for 2022-23. Please invite people to consider these roles or give me their names and I can contact them. Our programming is only successful because of our many volunteers!

Old Business:

- Updates regarding recruitment for Youth Director position (Pastor Fred).
 - No applications to date. Fred and Sally will look to the congregation and recruit. May also consider altering the job expectations and pull-out administrative portions.
 - Also need to recruit SS Superintendents. Works well to have co-superintendents.
 - 4K SS teachers are needed to finish out this year.
- Updates related to back-up staffing for the Office Coordinator position. We have a person willing to be an occasional back-up, but a relief admin staff for the church office is being recruited as well.

New Business:

- · Discussion related to updated Public Health Guidelines.
- · Covid infection rates are decreasing. St John's has followed CDC guidance throughout COVID, and a new CDC link provides

information about transmission rates by county. The link then offers guidance related to masking, etc. based on hospital admissions/bed availability and the total number of new Covid-19 cases in each county.

- · Using this tool, as of today, the transmission rates in Sauk, Dane, and Columbia counties are rated 'low', and the resulting guidance is:
 - Stay up-to-date with Covid 19 vaccines.
 - Get tested if you have symptoms.
 - Masking is optional unless you have symptoms, a positive test, or have had a known exposure.
 - Immunocompromised individuals, or those at high risk of severe disease are encouraged to talk to their healthcare provider about prevention.
- · At St John's, as of Thursday, March 3, 2022, masking will be optional for the congregation. NOTE: CDC guidance states that if infection rates increase, masking may return, and we will follow their guidelines.
- Exceptions to the mask optional plan are for the music and singing groups. These groups will work together to meet comfort levels for masking vs not.
- · After Easter, we will consider restarting fellowship coffee and donuts, offering collections, and returning to traditional communion options.

Next meeting is Tuesday, April 5, at 6:30 pm. Devotion will be given by Marian DeGiovanni.

Gina made a motion to adjourn our meeting, and the motion was seconded by Megan. Motion carried.
