Dear Sisters and Brothers.

On Feb 19, we received 32 new members onto our official list of active members. Some of these people have been participating in the life of this congregation for some time. Others have more recently started attending. All expressed a sense of welcome from the congregation and all feel as though this place is their place.

During our New Member class, I found out people's church backgrounds. Some had Lutheran roots, whether ELCA or other various Lutheran bodies. Some had Catholic roots and some, other backgrounds. In all cases, those joining found themselves here because of their histories and because they felt St. John's was a place that welcomed them.

Part of welcoming new people into a congregation (or any organization for that matter) involves recognizing that we have various histories and thus various ways of seeing the world. It requires acknowledging that we bring different gifts and see the world in different ways.

The gift of new people joining a group is that new ideas come with them. As a church (the body of Christ) we acknowledge this reality. We realize that every time a new person joins us, we are changed. Sometimes those changes are hardly noticeable. Sometimes they can be seen immediately. But in all cases, we change as we welcome more people into the fellowship of believers we call, St. John's.

One of the joys of being a Lutheran is that we are not required to believe everything that everyone else believes. Rev. Sara Cutter, the keynote speaker at the synod's LEAD event on Feb 11, put it this way, there is a difference between, 'Unity vs. Uniformity.' We are unified by Christ. We are not required to have uniformity in our beliefs. We can have different religious, political, social and other views and still belong to the body of Christ. This is because we JOIN a congregation by our own actions; we ARE JOINED to the body of Christ by the action of God. Joining depends on us; being joined is the work of Jesus.

I invite you to meet our new members and get to know them. I also invite you to understand that while they are new to this place, they have been your siblings in Christ a lot longer!
