Dear Sisters and Brothers,

During the middle of March, three long-time members of our congregation died: Marvin Beuthin, Paul Bringle and Jeannine Robertson. They were active members in our congregation for decades. They blessed me and they blessed our congregation.

Question. Who has blessed you? Think about it, who has blessed you? Whether you are nine or ninety-nine, people have come into your life and blessed it. This is true for us all. You know who these people are as soon as they move away, die or somehow are no longer part of your life.

The other question I want you to ask is this, "Who have you blessed?" Are you surprised at the question? You shouldn't be, because you are a blessing to someone. You may not know it, but it is true. You are a blessing to someone.

When I asked, "Who is a blessing to you?" Who did you think about? What person came to mind? Now ask yourself, "Do they know it?" If you answer "no," then ask "Why?" It may have to do with the fact that you haven't told them. And if that is true, could you imagine someone not telling you that same truth? Could it be possible that neither you or they have told others, not because it isn't true, but rather because you or they may feel uncomfortable saying that truth out loud.

We have been both a blessing to others and have been blessed by others. This truth might remain hidden, but that makes it only sad that you and others don't know it. But it doesn't mean it isn't true. It just means it is hidden from you and from others.

Let me suggest that we stop hiding this truth. Let me suggest that April be a month where you and I take time to let those who have blessed us know their importance in our lives. Let us remember that life is short and that doing today what we know is important, will make tomorrow a better place in which to live.

I wonder how many days you have gone without knowing how important you are to those around you? I wonder how many days have gone by for those who have blessed you without their knowledge of that truth? Let's agree to make that number zero.

Thank you for how you have blessed me and my family. I have so many stories of grace and forgiveness that have come from serving as one of your pastors. In April I will work on making sure you know that.

Good Friday is April 7 and we will have two worship services that day as well, one at 1:00pm and one at 6:30pm, both also available in St. John's and on Zoom.


