Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Well, it has started. I have begun cleaning my office. I say 'begun' because I wonder how long this process will take. I know that it took 25 years to bring things into my office. I also know that I have only 2.5 months to remove them. The math is not on my side.

Today (June 19) my 'cleaning' is focused on sorting my files. Mostly this looks more like recycling/shredding than sorting. I went through all my wedding and funeral folders. Each one reminding me of joy and sadness shared by a pastor and members. One of the funeral folders was for Verona Gruber.

Verona's funeral was Nov 12, 1998. She died at Maplewood Nursing Home. Verona was a long-time member of St. John's AND she had been the organist at St. John's for most of the time Eldor Fruehling was pastor.

The senior pastor, Don Wendt, was on vacation when the call came from the funeral home. Shortly after, I got a call from her son. He knew I had been at St. John's for barely three months. He asked if it might be possible for Eldor to conduct the service. After all, they had worked together for those many years. I told him I would speak to Eldor about it.

I knew that this was a problem. Eldor had retired and I was now Verona's pastor. Pastors are supposed to separate themselves from their congregation so that the new pastor can move into this role. As I considered the family's request and my newness to the pastoral task, I asked Eldor if he would be open to conducting, preaching or even simply offering prayers during the service. His answer was short, 'No.' And it made all the difference in the world. "I will come as a member of the congregation, grieving her death and looking to hear the gospel message of resurrection hope," he said. I called the family to let them know of his decision.

The funeral happened – the gospel was declared – the Good News of Christ was announced. But something else happed at that funeral. I became a pastor to the people at St. John's. Eldor's gracious 'no' allowed me to fully embrace the role of pastor. I did not know Verona and everyone knew that. Yet my job that day was not to tell others about how much I knew about Verona, but rather to tell them about how God's grace and mercy was made fully known in the person of Jesus. Eldor made that possible. I will forever be grateful for his decision.

What does religious liberty actually include? What are our scriptural and confessional resources for probing such questions about civic life? We invite you and your congregation to explore these questions and more by using "A Study Curriculum on Civic Life and Faith." This study curriculum has just been released by the ELCA Task Force for Studies on Civic Life and Faith. It includes six sessions and is a critical step on the way to the social statement called for by the 2019 Churchwide Assembly.

There is a response form after each session for participants to communicate with the task force itself on the material covered.


