Dear Siblings in Christ,

I have been wondering what to say in my last few Visitor articles.

Last month I spoke of how grateful I was to hear NO from Pastor Fruehling. As you may remember, Eldor said NO to a request from a family to conduct a funeral. His NO meant that I could step into the role of pastor in a new and significant way. His NO allowed me to say YES to the family and YES to fully stepping into being your pastor.

This month I want to speak of how grateful I am to hear another NO and how it allowed me to say YES.

The last semester at seminary is full of transitional anxiety. All the final paperwork, interviews and last-minute stuff is, or will be, completed. Seniors are hearing about congregational interviews and potential moves. In short, the campus is abuzz with excitement and a bit of fear.

My process unfolded in such a way that I was one of the first students to hear of a site that I would be interviewing at. It looked good on paper; it was an associate pastor position; it was near Madison and all that I could see gave me reason to be hopeful that I would soon have news to tell my fellow students. At least that is what I thought would happen.

The interview started well but changed quickly. It became obvious early that the kind of pastor they were looking for was different than the one they were interviewing. It was also obvious that I was not the pastor they needed. A second interview occurred just between the senior pastor and myself. That confirmed all of our gut reactions. They said NO to me.

Time passed, May graduation occurred and what started to look like a fast track to my career as a pastor, slowed WAY DOWN. My colleagues were getting calls, making plans to move and I was feeling like I would never find a place. I was wrong.

Early in June I heard of St. John's. I met with Pastor Don Wendt and a few weeks later, with the call committee. A congregational vote occurred, and August 8<sup>th</sup> found us moving into the parsonage. On September 6, 1998, I was ordained.

St. John's said YES to me. I said YES to St. John's, and I cannot express my gratitude for all that those 25 years have given me and to my family.

Sometimes a NO from one place means a YES to something much better.

### A message from Gather Magazine:

Gather has been dealing with not only the need to work further ahead due to increased production, shipping, and mailing times, but (together with the entire WELCA churchwide organization) budget and staff reductions due to a pandemic-related decline in giving during 2020. The good news is that the situation is now changing!

First, giving to Women of the ELCA rebounded in 2021 and 2022, and the organization's first-ever capital campaign is intended to help sustain and grow the organization for years to come.

Second, this past week another staff person joined the magazine, returning us to a full staff of two full-time employees (our staffing level prior to the pandemic). The new staff member will be introduced in the next e-newsletter.

For many religious publications, the effects of the pandemic have been difficult and lingering. Some publications ceased publication or decided to go online only. Gather remains committed to print publication. But doing more with less has not been easy, especially over the past year. Now, finally, we are positioned to get ahead of things again. The Sept/Oct issue is set to arrive in homes August 19-26 and the Nov/Dec issue is set to arrive earlier, October 14-18. From there, we will continue to move things back, week by week, to provide more cushion against longer shipping and mailing times. We appreciate everyone's prayerful support as we make this happen.

If you would like further conversation, please let me know and I will be happy to be in touch by email or phone. If your members do not receive Sept/Oct by August 26, you can email me directly and I can send the copies by priority mail.

We are working now to catch up on all correspondence and messages, knowing that these messages (and our response time) will lessen as we return to arriving in homes early.

What does religious liberty actually include? What are our scriptural and confessional resources for probing such questions about civic life?

We invite you and your congregation to explore these questions and more by using "A Study Curriculum on Civic Life and Faith."

This study curriculum has just been released by the ELCA Task Force for Studies on Civic Life and Faith. It includes six sessions and is a critical step on the way to the social statement called for by the 2019 Churchwide Assembly.

There is a response form after each session for participants to communicate with the task force itself on the material covered.

The schedule for adult education opportunities this Fall is currently under construction. Please keep an eye out in bulletins and Friday Notes emails for more information coming soon!

### Rev. Eldor Fruehling's Message

A reflection by Rev. Eldor Fruehling at his celebration of his 70th ordination anniversary:

I am extremely grateful for this day. Grateful also for the gift of life. I want to express my gratitude to Pastors Rilling and Williams for calling attention to this milestone in my life. I also want to express thanks to all who joined in this celebration through attendance preparation, cards and contributions.

My journey of life began when I was blessed to be born to a Christian family in a sinful world. My parents made certain that I was brought into the kingdom of God through baptism where the gift of the Holy Spirit was given to me. This gift was in the form of a seed that in order to grow needed nourishment and so my parents taught me the 10 Commandments, the Creed, the Lord's Prayer, placed in my hands the Holy Scripture, brought me to the services of God's house and followed the proverb "Teach a child in the way he should go so that when he is old, he will not depart from it."

Unfortunately, the growth of these seeds is often hampered by the seeds of weeds. After having been baptized by the Spirit, Christ was led into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. Similarly, I have found that the early years of my life, and later as well, have been a battleground between the two Trinities. The Trinity of Father, Son and Holy Spirit. And the unholy trinity – the devil, the world and my own flesh. It has been a continual battle between good and evil and in this battle, I was called through Ordination to a specific assignment to lead fellow travelers to growth in the kingdom through the preaching, teaching and administering of the Sacraments for a specific period of time and a specific group. This is a Church Rite commanded by the scriptures for the sake of order. And while it is a call to feed the lambs and sheep of the flock, one is also a member of that flock. As there is a call into ordination, there is also a call to an end of that assignment but to a new area in which one is a servant of the Lord. For 39 years of my life, I was permitted to grow in faith through ministering and being administered to by fellow believers. In the years that followed, I was permitted to serve as a trustee in the Village of Prairie du Sac. The privilege of sharing the message of God's love is never ending. If I look back and summarize how that seed of baptism has grown, it has led me to where I would summarize it in these words:

"Jesus loves me this I know, for the Bible tells me so." Amen.
