Dear Friends of St. John's,

March is upon us, and with it there always comes this sense of awakening. The sun feels stronger, the warmth is coming back, snow is melting, creation is waking up from the winter sleep. We are probably getting ready to plant a garden, looking at possible plants and flowers to grow, maybe looking at purchasing a new lawn mower, lawn tools, gardening accessories, etc. There is an excitement in the air where we have hopefully made it through another winter, and we are actively looking ahead at the next season.

The minutes from the previous Congregational Meeting held on October 15, 2023, are printed below so that you may read through them prior to the meeting on March 10<sup>th</sup>. Please note if there are any corrections to be made.

### Congregational Meeting, October 15, 2023

(In building and via Zoom platform)

PPC Executive Director, Nancy Kaufman, confirmed at least 50 voting members were present and called the meeting to order at 9:02am. The purpose of the meeting is to approve the 2024 budget, vote on nominees for the Parish Planning Council, approve nominating committee members for PPC recruiting and approve Synod Assembly volunteers.

The minutes of the October 2022 Congregational Meeting were published in the October Visitor as well as in the October 8 and 15, 2023 Sunday bulletins in lieu of reading them at the meeting. Motion to approve the minutes as provided was made by Peter Heide and seconded by Donna Nelson. Motion was approved by unanimous vote.

Nancy described the 2024 budget changes and pointed out those most significant changes including an increase for the Youth Gathering trip that will happen in 2024, and a decrease for Parish Education for a change in The Lutheran magazine. There is also a plan to restart outsourcing Vacation Bible School. WELCA has decreased their budget numbers to better match actual spending and the Administration budget includes salary for a Lead Pastor and Intern as well as an increase in benefits and other costs for current staff. The Benevolence budget is down due to no seminary assistance needed for interns this fall, but that will return next fall. A motion to approve the budget was made by Donna Knickmeyer and seconded by Alice Chenoweth. Motion was approved by unanimous vote.

Nancy thanked our outgoing board chairs for their years of service and then moved on to list nominees of: Evangelism Chair – Gwen Ringelstetter, Fellowship Chair – Cathy McAlexander, Parish

Education Chair – James Newman, Youth Board Chair – Tracy Pape and Youth Member-at-Large – Sean Jager. A motion to approve the nominees was made by Eunice Yanke and seconded by Jerry Kaufman. Motion was approved by unanimous vote.

Third, we approved the Nominating Committee to recruit members for additional PPC members that includes Pastor Sally, Janelle Hupp as the outgoing PPC Director, three congregational members (self-nominated) that include Kathy Lovell, Josie Fentress, and Donna Knickmeyer. Three PPC members will be determined. A motion to approve the nominees was made by Marilyn Herschleb and seconded by Donna Nelson. Motion was approved by unanimous vote.

Our final topic was to accept nominations for attendees to the Synod Assembly in May 2024. We can send 3 adults (either 2 males and 1 female or 2 females and 1 male), 1 young adult (under 30 years old) and 1 high school youth. Pastor Sally is also a voting member. Dale Haroldson, Nancy Passehl and Linda Lintl were nominated to attend. A motion to approve the nominees was made by Mary Weeks and seconded by Crystal Lautenbach. If any adult under 30 or a high school youth is interested, please contact Linda Hines in the church office.

An update on the Interim Pastor by Nancy included that we are close to signing a six-month contract and if it is finished, the Interim will begin November 1, 2023. Bill Burton made the motion to adjourn the meeting, and this was seconded by Anne Klinkner. Director Nancy Kaufman asked if there were any objections and after receiving none, she adjourned the meeting at 9:12am.

Dear Friends in Christ.

One summer day a number of years ago I went to a children's museum with my daughter and some of her friends. There was a stage with props and costumes, just begging to come alive. I noticed right away the rich imaginations each one of the girls activated that day. They were so playful and creative. There wasn't stress over what the plotline would be, there wasn't worry about doing something wrong, and they worked together and encouraged each other's ideas along the way.

The adult onlookers...well, we never really caught on. We got stuck wanting to have a clear plan, and we were worried about our egos and what others would think. But overall, we were just in awe of these young people who joined the land of make-believe and made it come to life.

This memory got me thinking about how often we lose our sense of imagination and freedom as we age, which often means we lose some of that playfulness, fun, and freedom. Now, not everything in life can be playful, fun, and free. However, I can't help but wonder how much we hold ourselves back.

This Lenten season we have been engaging the Psalms and striving to find rest in the Lord. The Lord who is our shepherd, shield, fortress, our quiet trust, and who is inescapable. The Lord is our strong foundation, grounding us in the midst of chaos. So resting in that strong foundation that cannot be shaken, what might it look like if we got in touch with our childlike imaginations as we think about our faith and our role in this world as God's people?

What might you do in the Lord's name if you weren't worried about the ego, understanding all the details, and trusted in the Lord and in yourselves? Would you teach or preach? Would you write or sing? Would you be more generous or take on a leadership role? What might the strong foundation you have in the Lord and your rich imagination lead you to do?

I invite you to ponder this question for yourselves for the rest of the Lenten season. Listen to your heart. Listen for the Spirit's whisper and sometimes the Spirit's roar. Get in touch with the childlike imagination and confidence to live the life God has created for you!

### **Meet the Parish Planning Council**

In continuance with our series on the different boards that make up our Parish Planning Council, this month we spotlight two of our boards – the Parish Education Board and the Executive Director/Assistant Director positions.

The Parish Education Board is currently made up of 5 members. Our Sunday School Superintendents Miranda Jager and Joanna Jones, Youth Director Penny Johnson, Pastor Sally Williams, and chairperson James Newman

The board supports, organizes, and budgets for all church activities pertaining to the education of children and adults. The most obvious of these are Sunday School and Confirmation classes which handle religious education for our young people from preschool age all the way through freshman year of high school. In particular, the board finds volunteers from the congregation to teach and help these classes, selects where offerings go to each year, organizes events throughout the year such as the hayride and Christmas Program, funds a meal on Wednesday nights to make attending confirmation classes easier, and places Bibles in the hands of our 3-year-old and 3rd grade children. The board also facilitates anything needed for Adult Education and the Church Library.

### The Executive Director/Assistant Director

This position is a 4-year term. You spend 2 years as the Assistant Director. As the Assistant Director your duties are as assigned by the Executive Director for special projects, but there are no regularly assigned tasks. They fill in when the PPC Secretary is unavailable for a meeting to take the minutes. They fill in for the Executive Director and lead the PPC meeting when the Executive Director is unavailable. They also sit on the Executive Committee.

The Executive Director moves from Assistant after 2 years for a second 2-year term.

The Executive Director manages the monthly Parish Planning Council meeting. They create and send out the PPC agenda each month. They confirm the Treasurer's balance numbers each month and sign off on such. They are the person that oversees all of the activities of the church but doesn't necessarily attend those activities.

The Executive Director meets with the Pastors monthly to assess needs and issues. This year, with no lead pastor the Executive Director is also responsible for staffing issues and reviews. Also to advise and oversee the transition process.

They also meet with PPC chairs for the various committees as needed and chair the Executive Committee when meetings are warranted.

 The team has met once and will continue to meet regularly.


### **New Business:**
