

Dear Friends of St. John's,

Each one of us has a faith story. We all have a story about how we came to faith, how we came to believe in Jesus, and how that belief has shaped our lives. Each one of us has a uniqueness to our story that is only ours. And for some of us, our story is maybe laid out as a smooth path. For others, maybe our story is rocky, unstable, full of twists and turns. Maybe our faith story has been deeply contemplative. Maybe our faith story has been as exciting as a roller coaster ride, or as serene as a calm beautiful day. Maybe our faith story contains moments that are full of asterisks, footnotes, and definitions. For each of us, our faith story is about us. We are not only the receivers of the story, but we are also the authors of how we write that story as a continuation for the sake of our lives, as we move through the intricacies of life's unknowns.

Part of my faith story is about that unknown space and what happened. I was 14, a freshman in high school, and really did not have too many close friends. It was not until I met a few other kids who joined high school theater with me, who were all attending the same church, that my life would never be the same again. Three particular friends spoke about how their youth group was awesome, and that I should come to a lock-in. I was skeptical, and yet because I liked hanging around these friends, I gave the lock-in a try. One of these friends became my best friend for 20 years. Next thing I know, I am involved with the youth group, going to summer bible camp, attending synodical youth gatherings, going to the national youth gathering in Dallas, and serving on council as "the youth rep." Both pastors serving this church became highly influential in my faith formation and growth. They are very influential as to how I preach a sermon to this day.

When I was 15. I attended bible camp again, but I was there as a CIT (counselor in training). I remember one night at our closing campfire, I began to cry, and couldn't stop. I stepped outside for a breath of fresh air, and at that moment, I sat down by a tree, closed my eyes, and felt the Holy Spirit's nudging. It was then that I realized what I was called to do in my life. I was being called to serve the church as a pastor. I told everyone about this revelation, and everyone who saw potential in me to serve the church affirmed it. My two pastors were elated, and both of those men were there the day I was ordained. In fact, the senior pastor who influenced me when I joined the youth group was the one to present me to the church for the ordination itself. I would go on to learn the necessary tools, skills, and education to become an ordained minister in the ELCA. And I could not have done any of that without the influence, support, and friendship of those who journeyed with me. And my faith story started because I was invited to go to a church lock-in.

Bethany Lutheran Church in Minot ND continues to be a very important venue of faith and reflection for me. Many important life events for me happened there: I was confirmed there, I was ordained there, my Mom's funeral was held there, weddings that I was in were held there, and my absolute best friend of 20 years, one of the three who influenced me to come to church and try the youth group, his funeral was held there too. Rest in peace my brother in faith, Bram.

My faith story includes many people and many places: many moments shaping and inspiring me to journey with Jesus and learn about the beauty of community and the gift of relationships. Each person along the way has been a gift. That very gift continues. You, St. John's, add to my story of faith. You contribute to my faith story with who you are, with your gifts, with your humanity, with your questions, and with your grace and forgiveness. Thank you so much. So, I ask you, what is your faith story? Who has been there to shape your faith story? How has your faith story shaped who you are? I would love to know. Send me an email, drop by the office, or let's go out for a coffee. I look forward to hearing your faith story. Blessings to you.

In April, 28 ladies attended Circle Meetings, with Diane Elsing, Barb Salveson, Marian DeGiovanni and Kathy Lester leading the Bible Study. In May, the Study will be led by Diane Elsing, Mary Weeks, Marian DeGiovanni and Kathy Lester. The Study for May will be on Mental Health and Wellness by Ellen Seyfried.

The Baraboo Conference Spring Gathering was held on Saturday, April 20th, at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Baraboo. Seven ladies (Eunice Yanke, Marian DeGiovanni, Darlene Holl, Diane Elsing, Kathy Lester, Sandra Frey, and Ruth Dresser) attended. There were 35 ladies from churches all over the area attending this event. After registration, we were treated with coffee and treats. Then there were Devotions led by Pastor Karen. This was a very nice way to begin the day. First, we sang the hymn "Christ Has Arisen, Alleluia", then she had prepared and asked 10 ladies to each read a verse about the resurrection and a prayer following the verse.

The speaker of the day, Keri Olson, from Baraboo, then gave a very inspirational talk about hope in the midst of adversity. She is a 3-time cancer survivor. She has had 14 surgeries; some were on the brain and also the spine. All at the same time that her mother passed away. Is there hope? Joy, gratitude and hope are still with us. She said that in the Bible there are approximately 430 verses about Joy and 157 about Gratitude. She kept a little journal acknowledging and listing 3 blessings each morning and again at night listing 3 blessings. She tried to focus on grateful living, doing something kind, expressing joy for small things. Some of the verses are Galatians 5:22, Philippians 4:4-9, 1 Thessalonians 5: 13-18, Psalm 95:2, Psalm 100. Keri has written 3 books, one is called "Find Your Heart, Follow your Heart; Get to the Heart of What Matters and Create your Abundant, Authentic, Joyful Life". Kathy Lester had the lucky number and "won" this book at the Gathering, and she will share it with others after she has read it. You can also find it on Amazon and there is a little write-up about Keri Olson.

There was a short business meeting with Carolyn Meyer (Baraboo Conference Coordinator) asking what some of the churches are doing. Most are doing the same as we are, except some are seeing the local needs and are giving school kits, quilts and some of the other items to local charities rather than LWR. There was an offering taken which will be given to PPP, (Period Positivity Program) It is to help purchase feminine products for young girls who are in need. The amount collected: \$242, will be split between the PPP and our Synod. St. Peter's Lutheran Church in Loganville will be hosting the Spring Gathering in 2025 and St. John's in Leland will be assisting them.

Then a very delicious Soup and Sandwich lunch was served. We could build our own sandwiches and there were 3 kinds of soup to choose from. BIG THANK YOUs to Marian DeGiovanni and Darlene Holl for driving us to Baraboo for this event. We are so grateful to them for always getting us where we need to go and back home again safely.

We are planning an All-Circle Picnic which will be held on July 18 at 10:00 a.m., in the Fellowship Hall. The picnic will take the place of our regular Circle Meetings in July. The Bible Study will be led by Pastor Jason. Lydia Circle will be in charge of the brunch and will be furnishing the food and doing the serving. We'll have more information in the June Visitor. We urge you to mark your calendars now and plan to attend.

We need to be thinking about our Lutheran World Relief kits very soon. The deadline this year is September 14. Last year, Ginny Nimmow gave us important information about requesting \$250 grants from Thrivent. Each group (health, sewing, baby, personal care and school kits) was able to receive a grant to help with the expense of each kit. The quilting group was also delighted to be able to receive the grant. We were able to send more boxes of kits and quilts last year than ever before. The sales for the school kit items usually begin the last part of July or the first part of August. Garage sales are good places to shop for some of the other kits. We have a lot of shopping and work to do between now and September. The quilters work very hard all year. We all work hard but it is a nice feeling to be able to provide all these items for the people who need them. We are thankful that Linda always puts the lists for each kit in bulletins and Visitors. SAVE THE DATE: Mark your calendars now for October 5th. There will be a Women's Ministries RETREAT at Bethany Lutheran Church in Wisconsin Dells. More details will come later. This is the occasion when we have the "Pennies for Poverty" Jar... and the last couple of years we have used this money for a place of our own choice. Two years ago, we were able to give \$200 to Hope House and last year we gave \$300 to 6:8. WE CALL YOUR ATTENTION AGAIN to the Pennies for Poverty Jar on the name tag table. Please toss your coins, bills or whatever you can in the jar! It all counts up and it will go to a worthy cause!!

Thank you so much to all of you who have taken the time to offer your thoughts, concerns, and questions so far. We very much appreciate your input during this process of transition. We know this is a time of uncertainty and yet, we also trust that the Holy Spirit is alive and well in our engagement with each other, leading us and strengthening us in our mutual care and concern for the future of St. John's.

One of the questions that we continue to receive is around the main difference between the transition team and the call committee. <u>They are two separate teams</u>. The **transition team** is formed with two goals:

1) To discover a new and deepened sense of identity and purpose for the congregation.

2) To establish a healthy relationship with the next rostered minister.

The transition team does this by engaging in the self-study process – intentionally looking at who the congregation has been, who the community is now, and who God is calling the community to be in the future. The self-study creates a roadmap for the congregation and the call committee, acknowledging all aspects of the congregation's identity for the sake of the future. The transition team gathers information through conversation with you in various ways and means, offering you the dedicated time and opportunities to offer your questions, concerns, observations, hopes, dreams, etc.

This information is collected, organized, and compiled into a document that will help inform the call committee in being able to complete a churchwide document known as the Ministry Site Profile. This document is important as it helps inform possible pastoral candidates as to the type of church you are, contextual considerations, specifics for pastoral gifts and ministry needs, cultural considerations, congregational history, etc.

Whereas, the **call committee** builds on the work of the transition team, striving to identify the candidate who is best suited to lead the congregation into God's future and recommend that candidate to the congregation for call. The call committee does not look for the best candidate of those given, but the right candidate for this congregation at this point in its life. The work of the committee is done prayerfully, and the people on the committee open themselves to the call and movement of the Holy Spirit. Because of the Spirit's activity, serving in this manner is transformational. Forming the call committee as the transition team nears the end of their period of self-study and discernment, the council begins work on forming the call committee. The call committee's work, however, will not start until the transition team's report is completed and submitted.

Please note: work within both of these teams takes time. It takes considerable time to gather information, compile it, and then generate the paperwork necessary for the call process. This work is then sent to the Synod where it undergoes its own process into the pool of available pastoral candidates open for a called pastoral vacancy. Please be patient and understanding as this process happens. Please keep the transition team in your thoughts and prayers, asking God to lead and guide the process through the Holy Spirit's navigating, so that the best fit for your next lead pastor is made known.
