Dear Friends of St. John's,

In last month's Visitor, I talked about my faith story and how it all started for me. When I think about how important my "home church" is to me to this day, I am incredibly thankful for its presence and how it has been a venue of a lifetime of memories. Bethany Lutheran Church is not just a church, but a place that is deeply connected to the formation of my calling, and life events that shaped, confirmed, and even challenged my faith.

Affirmation of Baptism: I was confirmed here. My pastors made sure we learned and memorized the Creed, the Lord's Prayer and the Ten Commandments, as well as learning and memorizing Luther's explanation of it all. Confirmation day was a special day, wearing a white robe, flower pinned on it, and I of course, wearing a non-white collared shirt with a bow tie! To this very day, if you go down to the basement of the church where all our class pictures are, there you can see me smiling from ear to ear, big glasses, terribly feathered hair, standing beside my best friend, and the tune "one of these things is not like the other" echoing in my head noticing the attire blunder.

Wedding: My best friend Bram was married here. I stood as his best man in a small ceremony in the chapel. Everyone he loved was there, and true to form for the day, Bram was smiling from ear to ear, happy, as I had ever seen him. His bride-to-be was beautiful; his family were supportive and jovial. It was a beautiful day, and one that I cherish still.

Ordination: I was ordained here. Everyone whom I loved, gathered in the sanctuary on August 25, 2002. I had asked both my pastors (who had long since left this church for other adventures) to assist in the service: Pastor Arland and his wife Gerda presented me to the Bishop for ordination and Pastor Rick played us all a song capturing the spirit of the day. Both of these incredible pastors spoke into my life at age 14, affirming that I had gifts for ministry, and both encouraged me to think about attending seminary. My parents, grandparents, sister, spouse, friends, and pastors from around the synod all laid their hands on me offering their prayers, support, and blessings.

Funerals: I attended funerals for both Bram and my Mom, Linda, here. Bram died suddenly at age 33 of a heart attack. Everyone whom he loved, and who loved him were gathered in that sanctuary (where some 20 years before, he sat next to me on Confirmation Day) to celebrate his life. It was all painful, beautiful and faithful. My Mom, Linda died suddenly at age 61 of a hemorrhagic stroke at the base of her brain. Six years after Bram died, I found myself sitting in that sanctuary again, but with my family and my Mom's friends and coworkers. My Dad, my sister Jen, and I all held hands as we listened to the funeral service, sermon, and prayers. I felt numb, overwhelmed, and cried from my gut. My Mom was the rudder of our family ship, and her presence was our joy. We all gathered, gave thanks to God for her, and grieved our collective loss of such a wonderful and beautiful soul that my mother was.

During this month, there will be a written timeline in the fellowship hall where you and your family are invited to recall and share important life events related to St. John's. What important life events do you instantly remember? What happened in shaping your appreciation, your memories, and your thankfulness for being part of the St. John's congregation? Are there important moments or events that you recall with deep emotional connections to the church? We as a transition team would love to see the timeline full of your stories and memories. We know that we cannot move into the future, without knowing where we have come from, and where we are now without celebrating and learning from the past. We will gather as a church following worship on June 23 to talk about our history, process it, laugh and cry about it, and remember it. Please join me and the rest of the transition team as we connect your history into the present and future.

## **School Kit Supplies**

Five unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers

Five black or blue ballpoint pens

One box of 16 or 24 crayons

One 2 ½ inch eraser

One bath-size towel (not longer than 48" preferred)
Two bath-size bars of wrapped soap

One metal nail clipper

<sup>\*\*\*</sup>bath towels, soap and toothbrushes are especially needed



## Baby care kit supplies

Two cotton/cotton-blend t-shirts
Two gowns or sleepers without feeties
Two receiving blankets
Four cloth diapers
One hand towel, dark color
One sweater, sweatshirt, or
jacket with a hood, or include a baby cap
Two pairs of baby socks
Two bath-size bars of gentle soap
in its original wrapping
Two diaper pins or large safety pins

Sizes up to 24 months may be used. Consider varying the sizes of the clothing items so the care kit will continue to be useful as the baby grows. Gently used, clean items may be substituted for new ones.

## **Call to Order/Opening Remarks:**

Meeting was called to order at 6:05 p.m. by Nancy Passehl in Nancy Kaufman's absence. Nancy P asked for approval of the agenda. Motion to approve was made by Gina and seconded by Donna. Motion carried. A devotion/prayer was then given by Ellen.

#### **Secretary Minutes:**

#### Pastor/Intern Reports

## Interim Jason's Report:

· One of my favorite parts about being a pastor is being able to participate in the Affirmation of Baptism with students. I was honored and grateful for the opportunity to be part of our confirmation students' affirmation on April 28th. Such a beautiful celebration! I hope and pray that our students continue in their faith walk and grow in their faith and trust in the beautiful triune God.

- I continue to make dedicated home visits with our elderly and shut in members. I cannot tell you how much these visits mean to me in being able to connect with them, listen to their life stories, and offer caring conversation, holy communion, and prayer.
- MASSIVE thank you to Donna Nelson and her wonderful team of volunteers in offering the Volunteer Brunch as a thank you for all their time, talents, and treasure throughout the year. We could not achieve and accomplish the important tasks of ministry without our wonderful volunteers. You are so appreciated, loved, and cherished. Thank you, thank you, thank you.
- I was invited to be part of Confirmation Orientation night, welcoming a large class of incoming 7th graders for the fall. I was happy to explain the purpose and reasoning for kids attending confirmation to the parents, as well as teaching the kids about being an acolyte. Pastor Sally and I will help with shadowing these students this summer as they dip their toes into the waters of worship assisting and the various opportunities that are offered.
- · I am extremely thankful for Linda Hines in "taking hold" with the small conversation I had with her about changing up how St. John's can help identify guests and visitors going forward. The system she put into place is easier, less cumbersome, and more identifiable for visitors. Linda not only designed the visitor cards, but printed them out, cut them, and ordered card holders for the pews. I am so grateful for her and her ingenuity in making this idea happen. THANK YOU, LINDA!
- · As mandated by the Synod, both Pastor Sally and I along with the entire rostered clergy within the Synod, have been participating in Anti-Racism workshops. These have been helpful and highly educational in terms of being able to think about and struggle with our sense of identity, privilege, and the race we live every day. One of the major areas that we have been studying, is how do people of color, race, nationalities, fit within the Imago Dei (Image of God)? How do we see ourselves in that image, and how do we see others in that image?

#### Sally's Report:

· We've been/will be celebrating baptism with a number of our families this spring. We also celebrated Affirmation of Baptism and our teaching staff during the last day of Sunday School. Being around and engaging with our students from birth on up is a great reminder that the Spirit is active among us. I encourage our council and congregation to reach out to these folks to celebrate these milestones as well as to thank our teaching staff for a very big

commitment to the ministry in this place. We are very blessed! (Graduation Sunday is coming up too!)

- In April we also celebrated Administrative Professional Day. Talk about feeling like words fail thank you is a very small way to reflect the deep gratitude I, and we as a congregation, have for Linda Hines. It is very obvious that this is not a job for her, but a ministry of presence, encouragement, comfort, organization (and many other things) that continues to enrich our faith community. Thank you, Linda!
- The celebration just continues these days with the Volunteer Appreciation Luncheon. We are fortunate to have so many willing volunteers. I want to especially lift up Donna, Doug, and Nicole Nelson and Cathy and Larry McAlexander for all of their hard work preparing, serving, and cleaning up for the luncheon. Thank YOU for the difference you make in this place.
- The anti-racism training required by the synod will be complete tomorrow (5/7/24).
- · I have also completed a boundaries training in order to be in 'good standing' as an internship supervisor and have begun the supervisor training online. I met with the internship committee in April to share more about our future intern and the responsibilities of the internship committee. We have a fantastic team formed and Nancy Passehl will continue to be a valuable resource for this committee with her past experience with former interns. A biography of our future intern will be published in the next visitor.
- · I am teaching a three-week series on the Holy Land for the first three weeks of May. That will end the Sunday sessions for the academic year. Pastor Jason and I are in conversation about some potential education opportunities for this summer.

TNT PPC Report – May 2024 submitted by Interim Pastor Jason · April was a busy month for the St. John's TNT. We took the entire month to try and gauge people's opinions, experience, concerns, and questions through small groups held in-between church services. This gave us the opportunity to visit with people in-person

by asking some new questions.

- The small groups were met with great enthusiasm, warmth, and openness. People who participated offered great insight, experience, and observations. The two new questions that were offered are as follows: 1) What brought you to St. John's and what keeps you connected and excited about St. Johns? 2) What are the priorities for our congregation for the development of our ministry?
- The TNT team members heard similar responses to the first question, using words like "welcoming, community, spirit, friendly,

open." Many people shared that they were invited to initially come to St John's. People very much appreciate the liturgy and the music. People also feel a sense of being connected and engaged. Many people also shared that they appreciate the traditional church, centering on the liturgical flow and structure. One response shared, "Felt a sense of connectedness to others and felt welcomed. Love the liturgy, the use of the common lectionary that ties us to others of the Christian faith around the world, there were so many friendly people embracing me from the start, a sense of community "Here we are, just as we are, and we belong together." It does not feel like a social club but rather felt like a place where we could join others in the work of the Church for the sake of the world and God's work among us all."

- · For question two, many responses involved looking beyond the walls of the church and offering support and ministry into the greater communities of PDS, and Sauk. People suggested, "being seen" by the community and the community knowing that the church is an advocate for them using words like, "involvement, outreach, seen, giving, helping."
- · Many responses also offered their concern for a continuation of the Reconciled in Christ consideration, "becoming more open and affirming of the LGBTQIA+ community and people who identify as such. Be bold and true to our idea that "All are Welcome." Lots of concern in being able to hold on to the Intern Program as people feel it enlivens a sense of change and opportunity to hear new voices and allows the congregation to grow in a sense of purpose as a teaching parish for students. Other direct responses offered were, "Is there a way to relearn how to be a community again since so many people have lost a sense of what community is over time? What does our faith teach us about community building? Can we teach and learn community-building skills/practices? "Are we willing and ready to be comfortable with the uncomfortable for the sake of growing in our living out the gospel of Christ? Change is uncomfortable always." "Think deeper about what our core values are the hold us firm and grounded even in the midst of change." "Think about the difference between our "hopes" and "where we are right now" and if we are willing to put in the effort to get to "where we hope to be". [What is our identity now? Who do we hope to be in the future?1"
- · Information we learn from the small group conversations is important in being able to understand the main concerns, trends, and questions people are wrestling with during this time of transition. Ultimately, the information will be used in formulating the content in a summary document of the transition phases to be

forwarded onto the call committee (TNT and call committee are two separate teams). The call committee will use that information in writing the main document (called the Mission Site Profile) which is then sent into the Synod indicating the congregation is ready to begin the call process for available rostered individuals who are open for call.

- · While the small groups were engaging and fruitful, the work continues. We will continue to gauge the congregation with more questions, but the next phase of the transition process is on the horizon. This will involve gauging the wider communities of PDS and Sauk, asking community members what their experience is of SJLC, how the congregation has made itself known, are we visible in the communities, what might be helpful suggestions from community people to meet their needs outside the walls of the church? We want to have conversations with community leaders to grocery store clerks to teachers, to area clergy from other denominations, to assisted living caregivers.
- · We ask that you continue to pray for the congregation in its questions, its concerns, its hope, and its faithfulness as we look to the Holy Spirit's leading and guiding, continuing the important work of transition so that the best and most qualified leader is led to be called as the next lead pastor for St. John's.

#### **Old Business:**

- · Sunday Steward sign up—completed through early Sept
- · Coffee --More help is needed with making coffee. We will have coffee during the summer after the 9 am service. Ellen has offered to create a short video to show how to make coffee.
- PPC Retreat Follow-up—new member pictures have been updated on the board. Try to find them and welcome them in person.
- Transition team update—Jason and Marie (Synod) are meeting tomorrow on update. See Jason's notes earlier in this document.
- Treasurer position—Bruce has started as Financial Secretary and is working with Donna to learn the duties. She will be responsible for the books through June and then he will officially take over. They continue to work toward a division of duties between the financial secretary and the PPC Treasurer.
- · Congregational meeting—Ruellene has reported that the organ repair timeframe is currently set for July/August.
- · Volunteer thank you lunch—wonderful attendance (about 90) and thanks to the Nelson's and McAlexanders!

#### **New Business:**

- Gift Acceptance Policy and Form—Stewardship Board presented a new Gift Acceptance Policy and form. The policy includes the conversion of existing stock that has been gifted to the church to cash and reinvested into money markets or certificates of deposit at a FDIC financial or at Mission Investment Funds. A motion was made to approve the policy and form and then to liquidate the stock currently being held. Motion to approve was made by James and seconded by Gina.
- Interim contract with Pastor Jason has been extended an additional six months
- Intern update. Nancy P is stepping down from intern chair because of upcoming PPC Exec Director duties to begin in October. Cliff and Cindy Thompson have agreed to accept the chair of this committee.
- Parsonage usage for school year 2024-2025. Decision was delayed pending additional conversations with the school district.
- Budget information will be sent to board chairs by Anne (Stewardship) in June to be due in July.

Next meeting is Tuesday, June 4, 2024, at 6:00 pm. Devotion will be given by Gina. Ellen made a motion to adjourn our meeting, and the motion was seconded by James. Motion carried.
