6:8's Community Outreach



Dear Friends in Christ,

I've been chewing on the following quote from George Addair, "Everything you've ever wanted is sitting on the other side of fear." I can't stop thinking about this; probably because there have been several times that fear has stopped me.

Viewing snake exhibits, driving go-carts, and riding Ferris wheels are some fears that I avoid, but I can argue keep me safe and alive (that might be a tad dramatic). Then there are the more complicated fears of speaking up in the heat of conflict, risking saying something that might make someone mad, or sharing my faith when someone on the airplane asks me what I do for a living. Does the avoidance of those fears keep me safe and alive? Or do they keep me safe in my mind, but keep me from living? Living fully, that is.

Faith and church are often described as a safe haven for people. A place and existence where they can feel buoyed up with comfort and strength and love. Yes, our faith and our church communities are beautiful sources of safety.

And. But. Yet....insert your favorite conjunction...alongside the comforting and healing Jesus did a lot of poking, prodding, and provoking as he challenged the powers that be, challenged the religious traditions, and challenged the hearts and minds of the people.

I wonder how we might make room for both of these things as we begin a new school year together? How do we make room for both being a place of refuge AND being a place of challenge for the sake of the Gospel?

I invite you to think about that this month and ask yourself where do you need some comfort and where do you need to be challenged? Habits and mindset? The way you think and/or judge others? Do you need to be kinder to yourself? More open to change?

The promise of refuge in Christ will always be there. As will the fear, most likely. But what will you do with it? Will you let it stop you? Or will you let it compel you to move through it and see what's on the other side?

There was darkness and fear and suffering on the cross, but on the other side was and is life, hope and peace. I can't help but wonder what might be on the other side of our fear when we really put ourselves out there and live as Jesus calls us to live. Wonder with me, my friends. "Be strong and courageous. Do not fear or be in dread of them for it is the Lord your God who goes with you. He will not leave you or forsake you." Deuteronomy 31:6.


