

Dear Friends of St. John's,

I love Christmas! I always have, ever since I was a little boy. I would often sit underneath the Christmas tree, look up at it, and see the bubble lights twinkling and bubbling, feeling their warm rainbow glow, and breathing in the aromatic pine as I checked and double-checked whose presents were the biggest. I would watch "A Charlie Brown Christmas" every year, listen to my favorite Christmas album by John Denver and the Muppets, and look forward to seeing my Grandparents after their long trek from Nebraska to North Dakota. Truth be told, I loved their arrival because it meant my Grandma brought cookies with her and who does not want Grandma cookies? It was a magical time being a kid, and experiencing that one time of the year, where all was "right" and peaceful in the world of my youth.

I had a positive experience with Christmas as a kid. But I know not everyone does. For many of us, the holidays not only bring out the best of emotions and memories, but conversely, it can evoke painful memories and emotions of hurt. I have met many people who in their expectation of the holidays, often just tolerate Christmas or Easter for another year, hoping that maybe this year, the memories might change, or the pain would heal. Sometimes, the holidays become a reminder of who is no longer in our lives but is missing from them. We wait, expect, and then lament the holidays with great emotional expanse because they are often associated with how things should be, with who should be there, and with the feelings and emotions we want to feel. The holidays can be associated with grief rather than celebration. If this has been your experience, know that you are not alone. Many of us know these disappointed expectations.

Christmas is a time of expectation. It is a time of waiting. When we are kids, it's difficult to wait for anything. But as adults, we know that waiting and expecting is part of the Christmas experience. Consider too that Mary waited for the arrival of her baby, and she treasured this time, fully expecting Jesus to be born. As a new father-to-be, Joseph waited on the time for Mary to give birth, and to welcome his beautiful son. The family to-be waited for the moment that this expected baby would arrive in the most humble of surroundings. This new family waited for his birth, who would be a gift for the entire world, throughout time. The world shined in that moment, where all was right and peaceful in that corner of the world.

Maybe our own little world, the world we expect and wait for, is a place where both celebration and disappointment exist. Where our own dreams of how life unfolds and surprises us in celebration are held in tension with the dreams of how life was meant to be, where we are left in disappointment. Yet here we are. We are alive. We are still here. And that is in itself, a gift. You are the gift. You are uniquely made to be a gift into this world where we live in both the brightness and the darkness of life's tensions. You are a gift to offer into the world, where your story of both joy and pain are unique to you, where you offer precious value, worth, and dignity as others are going through their own waiting and expectation. You are the gift of your own story to help others in theirs.

St John's, never forget who you are, and why you continue to follow the redemptive story of God. Never forget Whose you are during this time of transition, expectation, and waiting – named and claimed by God. Never forget Whose Spirit tends to you, guides you, and holds you close to the very heart who loves you and gives you the gift of life. I wish you and your family a very blessed holiday season, and a Merry Christmas.

Greetings,

Advent is a season of waiting, and preparing. We are encouraged to watch for signs, to listen, to get ready for what is coming. The inner child in me, does not necessarily *like* the idea of so much waiting! Very few of us are naturally patient, so maybe that is part of the reason why the month of December is full of treats and goodies-to reward our patience as we wait for Christmas Day!

A few weeks ago, I watched my children's piano teacher sit at their sides as the kids played their songs and made mistakes throughout. Additional practice would have certainly helped that week, but instead my kids found themselves bathing in their piano teacher's grace. She was so patient, sitting silently, not moving a muscle if their fingers missteped. She let the kids try to correct the mistake on their own. When they finished the piece, she would offer them some kind of genuine praise for either their performance, their progress, or their effort, no matter how closely it was played to the original intent of the composer.

I knew in the moment I was watching a master at her craft. She's a phenomenal pianist, of course, but her mastery was in patience, grace, and love! She met each child where they were for the day, and guided them, little step by little step, toward the eventual reward of a completed piano piece.

I see Advent like the waiting the piano teacher demonstrated. We wait and we wait, getting a little closer, listening as the sweet melody becomes clearer. The music stays the same as a piece is practiced again and again, just as Jesus' call to us stays the same. Throughout the church year, we are led and guided by Jesus' ever-present message of loving our neighbors, not storing up earthly things, and setting our hearts on the love of God in this world and for the next. We are the ones practicing, tuning our ear to the sound of the Gospel, and learning to glide our fingers along the keys to make beautiful music. May the waiting and preparation of this Advent, bring practice that makes beautiful music in your heart and light in the world around you. We give thanks for the patience and grace of our teacher, Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.

CONGREGATIONAL MEETING November 17, 2024

(In building and via Zoom platform)

PPC Executive Director, Nancy Kaufman, confirmed at least 50 active members were present and called the meeting to order at 8:58 am. The purpose of the meeting is to approve the 2025 budget, vote on nominees for the Parish Planning Council, approve Nominating Committee members for PPC recruiting, and approve Synod Assembly volunteers.

The minutes of the October 2023, Congregational meeting were published in the November Visitor as well as in the November 3 and 10, 2024 Sunday bulletins in lieu of reading them at the meeting. Motion to approve the minutes as provided was made by Donna Nelson and seconded by Brian Weeks. Motion was approved by unanimous vote.

Nancy described the 2025 budget changes that were printed and available for review in the bulletin. She pointed out those most significant changes including the administration budget that include salary expectations for a new senior pastor. The salary budgeted follows the synod's guidelines for salary which is based on years of experience. Health insurance premiums increase each year, and the youth trip was in 2024, so there will not be that expense in 2025. A motion to approve the budget was made by Janelle Hupp and seconded by Tracy Pape. Motion was approved by unanimous vote.

Nancy thanked our outgoing board chairs (Lon Kadaravek, Ellen Jorgensen, Anne Klinkner, Donna Nelson and Nancy Kaufman) for their years of service. She then moved on to list nominees of Nancy Passehl to Executive Director, Marv Hupp as Assistant Director, John Brennan as Treasurer, John Ballweg for Properties, Melani Wheeler for PR and Social Concerns. There is an opening for the Stewardship Board Chair. A motion to approve the nominees was made by Jayne Carlson and seconded by Marilyn Herschleb. Motion was approved by unanimous vote.

Third, we approved the Nominating Committee to recruit members for additional PPC members that includes Pastor Sally, Nancy Kaufman as the outgoing PPC Director, three congregational members (self-nominated) that include Mary Weeks, Dale Haroldson, and Donna Nelson. Three PPC members will be determined. A motion to approve the nominees was made by Marv Hupp and seconded by Melani Wheeler. Motion was approved by unanimous vote.

Our final topic was to accept nominations for attendees to the Synod Assembly in May 2025. We can send 3 adults (either 2 males and 1 female or 2 females and 1 male), 1 young adult (under 30 years old) and 1 high school youth. Pastor Sally is also a voting member. Alice and Joe Chenowith and Jordan Small (under 30) self-nominated. Nancy Kaufman will find an additional person to attend. A motion to approve the nominees was made by Megan Tarnutzer and seconded by Alexi Suchla. If any adult over 30 or a high school youth is interested, please contact Linda Hines in the church office.

An update on the Call Committee progress by Nancy included Interim Pastor Jason will be with us through the end of January. The last two years have been busy and included building issues including heat and AC, new roof, carpeting, and intern/not an intern/intern again, hired a financial secretary, and Pastor Fred retired. We look forward to the next years that will include a new pastor as well as our future and changes that will happen in the transition. Jerry Kaufman made the motion to adjourn the meeting and was seconded by Donna Nelson. Director Nancy Kaufman asked if there were any objections and after receiving none, she adjourned the meeting at 9:11 am.

- Discussion should continue on only having one worship service every week. The once-a-week service during the summer months allowed members to meet new people since both the 8:00 AM and 10:30 AM attendees were worshipping as one group at 9:00 AM.
- Having services no longer than one hour is a desirable goal. Pastor Jason and Pastor Sally are adjusting the services as needed right now to target a one-hour service. The Lay Ministry Committee should work with the pastors to identify what components of our worship service we value. Opportunities are

- Have the Forgiveness one time per month as part of the worship liturgy.
- Determine if we need to recite the creed each week.
- Say the Psalm response instead of singing it each week.
- Sing fewer verses of the selected songs for worship services. Sing only the verses that are sending the message of the service each week.

Identify a way to interact with the PTO boards or equivalent groups in each of the schools and post what activities are happening in the schools each week on the kiosk so congregation members can attend and support the activities our youth are engaged in. That could help us engage with our youth better. We could even provide refreshments to the sports our youth are involved in. The Council thanked Nancy Kaufman for her service.

The next meeting is Tuesday, Dec 2, 2024, at 6:00 pm.

Nativity of our Lord
