Dear Friends of St. John's,

There's an old saying that reads, "All good things must come to an end." I have been trying to find the most adequate and expressive words to share with you about my leaving St. John's. I knew this time was coming, and like all things that must end, I am feeling some anticipatory grief around it. I have been grieving my departure for some time, often becoming teary during worship watching you all come forward to receive communion and placing in your hands the body of Christ. The connection that I have felt with you all, in conversation with you, laughing with you, praying with you, working with you, and crying with you, has been life changing. You have reaffirmed my passion for congregational ministry over and over, and I cannot thank you enough for such a gift.

When I started my time with you, you gave me the time and space to begin the transition process with a very capable and talented team of people. I was honored to work beside them in their visioning and processing of the information they received, and ultimately reported on. The process of the TNT group was definitely a successful venture, and I know that this work was important for the continuation of the call process once it was handed off to the call committee. As I write this, the call committee is submitting the ministry site profile this week after their very dedicated commitment to process and complete it. Yet their work continues, and I ask that you keep them in your thoughts and prayers as the Holy Spirit calls your next lead pastor.

You have heard me say repeatedly that you are an incredible church. You truly are. You are a church that appreciates tradition, and yet you look ahead. You are a church that loves to share your abundant gifts into the world, and yet you are looking to see how you can be visible to bring Christ into the local community, where the diversity of God's creative beauty hopes for peace and equity. You have this time, as an amazing opportunity to grow yourself as a church, to expand your potential to reach as far as you can into the places Christ wants to go, to honor the God who made you and the same God who made your neighbors. You have so much potential to grow in faith and love towards each other, and into the greater world. Believe that you matter in this world, in your place as a church, as a community of fervent faith and ignited by the sparks of the Holy Spirit. You are doing and you will continue to do beautiful and great things to share the love and peace of Christ himself.

Many of you have asked me what is next for me. Right now, I am almost done with my own paperwork the ELCA asks of us pastors to fill out when we are open for call. This paperwork has been good for me to process my own theology, ministry, and hopes for a future within the local and wider church. Once completed, I send this to our synodical bishop, and then await a possible opening that would align with my gifts. I am also considering what another interim might look like. I may go back into hospice chaplaincy. Who knows? I am open to the Holy Spirit's leading and where she could take me.

This entire experience could not have been life changing and call re-affirming without some very incredible people I am honored to have worked with. Thank you to the entire TNT, PPC, and Executive Teams. You are all so gifted and I thank you for sharing your time, wisdom, and vision for the future of St. John's, I cannot thank the church staff enough for their dedication, influence, and gifts in making sure St. John's is the amazing place it is: Thank you Linda, Ruellene, Penny, John, and Bruce. I am honored to have worked with you. Thank you to Intern Elise. You have inspired me with your fire, your vision, and your calling. You are talented beyond words my friend. And I will be honored to call you an ordained colleague soon. And finally, I cannot thank Pastor Sally enough for being a true partner in this ministry. You are without a doubt, one of the strongest, most talented and gifted pastors I have had the privilege to work and partner with. Thank you for your wisdom, your advice, your listening, and your gentleness. Finally, I could not have dedicated myself to this experience without the love of my life, Megan. You have shown me grace, love, and peace as only a loving heart can. Thank you love.

St. John's, you will be missed very much. I will pray for you, hold you up, think about you often, and give thanks for you. You have given me so much: thank you, thank you, thank you. Alright, St. John's, I will preach one more time on January 26th (my 51st Birthday!!!!) and we will celebrate together.

They're usually about less sweets, more movement, and...hm...I can't think of other examples probably because they don't last longer than a week! Does any of this sound familiar to you? The members of the TNT Team are Kristin Ryan, Gary Tomter, Donna Knickmeyer, Megan Tarnutzer, Marv Hupp, Jordan Small, Derek Rosenstiel, and Pastor Jason. The purpose of the TNT Team was defining who we are as a St. John's church family and identifying our needs for our new pastor. Gathering the history of our church, identifying our priorities, and sketching out our future is work that must be done as a first step in finding a new pastor. Upon completing their tasks, the TNT Team handed over all the information that they gathered to our Call Committee to continue the work of finding the new pastor.
