Jesus instructs people to invite the poor, the crippled, and the blind to their banquets, even though they can't repay them.


The parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10)

Dear Friends in Christ,

There is nothing permanent except change. - Heraclitus

Don't we know it! Over the last year and a half, we said goodbye to Pastor Fred, welcomed Pastor Jason as our Interim Pastor, hired Bruce Fritsch, partnered with Luther Seminary to bring onboard Intern Elise, and now we've said goodbye to Pastor Jason and are moving toward the call process of calling a new Lead Pastor.

Before writing anymore, I want to give thanks to all of you for the ways you welcomed Pastor Jason into your lives and your faith journeys. I am grateful for yours and Pastor Jason's ministry to and with us over the last 15 months. We've shared many moments of hospitality, celebration, grief, laughter, and visioning together in this time together and I give thanks for it all!

So now what do we do? We're in a bit of limbo again and we have some choices to make personally and as a faith community. Do we 1) sit back and do nothing until we have a Lead Pastor, 2) continue on with the status quo or 3) be agents of change?

Options 1 and 2 sound really lovely, don't they? Let's just keep doing the same thing, stop reflecting and discerning who we are as God's Church, and wait until later. But....is that really what we're called to do? The truth is Jesus absolutely took time to rest throughout his ministry. He went away from everyone and stopped what he was doing. But it was always followed by action and change; whether it was challenging the powers that be, connecting with someone alienated from society, or teaching others that status quo is not the way of the kingdom.

So, I guess that means we should pick option 3, my friends. Though this option sounds riskier and requires action on all of our parts.

There are all sorts of wise quotes on the good ol' internet about change, but let's return to our foundation of God's Word instead as we think about change (though I did steal these directly from the internet \bigcirc):

2 Corinthians 5:17: "The old has gone, the new is here!" Ephesians 4:22-24: "Put off your old self, and put on the new self" Isaiah 43:18-19: "Behold, I am doing a new thing; now it springs forth"

Ecclesiastes 3:1-8: "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven

As these next months unfold, I invite you to ponder some questions for yourself in the midst of another transition and as always, I love to hear your thoughts on these!

What new knowledge or skills would I like to gain in my faith life?

How might I foster new, and improve old, relationships with people at church?

What new opportunities could I explore here (ushering, teaching, quilting, etc.) and outside of church (food pantry, tutoring, learning Spanish, etc.)?

What support do I need from my pastor and from my church family to do these things?

We are always being called to challenge ourselves and our world while resting in the secure, faithful arms of Jesus. It's only because of Him that we can change in the first place. Let's lean on Jesus as we come together to grow and change in His name!
