Dear Friends in Christ,

Back in January I shared the idea of ushering in 2025 with a word rather than a resolution. Here's what I wrote:

My word is curiosity. Sometimes I'm too quick to give an answer or think I already know the answer. It's easy to make assumptions and keep my blinders on. Curiosity gives me permission to ask more questions, to think more deeply, and better understand a particular position, situation, or person. It also gives me an opportunity to think differently about my faith. What is God up to? How is God calling me to be more curious when I read scripture or while I pray?

I enjoyed hearing the words that some of you picked for yourselves! Thank you for sharing them with me.

As we move into the season of Lent, I'm wondering how these words might continue to guide our life together. Perhaps you haven't chosen a word and want to (or not!). Word or not, we can still take some time to reflect during this season of the church year.

Our theme this year is radical hospitality, which is way more in depth than how to welcome someone into our building and into the congregation. I invite you to reflect on the following questions through the lens of your word (or just in general):

- 1. What is God calling me to let go of in my life so that I may offer radical hospitality?
 - 2. How can I live out love and compassion for others?
- 3. How can I nurture a spirit of radical hospitality during this season?
- 4. What significance does Christ's death and resurrection have on my understanding of radical hospitality and how do others see that in my daily living?

These are hard questions to answer if we're being honest, and perhaps we find ourselves failing more than succeeding at being disciples. We're in good company though. The Bible is full of stories of the disciples not quite getting it. But let's keep trying. Let's be very intentional about our work this Lenten season.

Grace and forgiveness and love abound. Christ's radical hospitality abounds.

Hello My name is

Where do you go when you need to think? Do you take a walk? Sit on the back deck? Drive in the car with no music? Take a long shower? Ride a horse? We all do this. It's part of being human. Jesus needed it during his 40 days in the wilderness to reflect on God's call for him. We need quiet time to think through big decisions; work through sadness or anger; to plan our next steps; or to just breathe into joy or contentment. It's a practice of *intention* to focus on something.

Lent is the equivalent of this time and space in the church year. Lent is a time set aside to find a bit of time to reflect and take inventory. Tradition suggests that we 'give up' something as a type of fasting for a type of being intentional. Popular items to give up are beer or chocolate. Personally, I never really felt like giving up chocolate made me feel any closer to Jesus. It would have to be something bigger than that, for me. We can also add in something to stimulate our faith and reflection; add in time for dawn prayer, sunset walks, or spiritual talks with a friend...

No matter if we are taking something away or adding something in, the goal is that time and space to think, reflect, and practice our intention of focusing on the ways that God is *already* calling us. God calls us in all sorts of ways from job changes to caring for our parents, to speaking the Gospel truth against injustices and choosing how and where we use our purchasing power.

Here in the northern hemisphere, Lent starts at the end of winter and stretches into the early signs of spring. The increase in daylight will focus me on hope, wonder, and awe. Where will you find that time to think and reflect? As you set your intention on the Lord, remember we are called to accept Christ's salvation, hear where we are already being called, and turn our faces toward the warmth of His shining Light.

Call to Order/Opening Remarks:

Meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Nancy Passehl. Nancy P asked for approval of the agenda. Motion to approve was made by Eunice and seconded by Gina. Motion carried. A devotion/prayer was then given by Marv.

Fellowship: Cathy McAlexander reported:

 Need to discuss cost/benefit of styrofoam/vs paper coffee cups/vs use of glass coffee cups. John B is pricing his source of cups, as well as Donna has been pricing cups at Gordon Food Service.

- · If glass cups are used dishwashing is involved. As hard as it is to have people volunteer to serve coffee, I'm afraid this would determany.
- · I'm sure the paper cups will be a significant increase in cost and that must be factored in.
- · I am strongly in favor of reducing styrofoam, but in view of the church finances, we must be responsible, both in cost and the environment.

- 2) Seminary Assistance \$2,000; 3) SP High School Scholarship \$500; 4) Campus Ministry \$1,000
- Budget ideas—these suggestions started at the PPC meeting.
 Considering changes to categories for most boards for petty cash, for Properties Board—add repairs and maintenance for parsonage subgroup. Should quilting be under Women ELCA or Fellowship?
- Publish ideas for request of giving money for bulletins and Visitor.
 Provide ideas of what money is used for and income/expense each month. Consider a visual poster in the gathering area which highlights what we are focusing on that month.

Lead pastor report: n/a

Sally's Report:

- Marv, Nancy, Dan Odden, and I are attending the synod's LEAD event in February and will report back to the council and congregation in March.
- · A Joint Statement on Immigration from our Bishops in Wisconsin and Upper Michigan was released last week. I will make copies for PPC and for the congregation to read. It is important that we understand and can speak to the statement of the ELCA on the many different policy changes and find ways to serve those who will suffer as a result.
- Please read this and help to share correct information. In response to some questions regarding Pastor Jason's departure:
 - The policy of the ELCA (constitution) and its churches is that interim pastors are not to stay on as called pastors where they have served unless otherwise pre-determined by the Bishop and Synod Council. The agreement among them which was communicated to Pastor Jason and the Exec Board was that he was not eligible to serve here.
 - Pastor Jason did not stay until we hired a new pastor because his work as our interim pastor was completed - he led us through the transition team's work and put together the call committee. We are grateful for his time and his work among us, but these two points are why he could not stay.
- The Sauk Prairie School District is using our building on Wednesday, February 19 for a training session for an emergency situation.
