

Dear Friends in Christ,

As I write this, the sun is shining out the window, the tulips and daffodils have been pushing their way onto this side of the dirt, and the birds are singing in the trees. It feels like Easter!

While it is exciting and enticing to think about leaving the season of Lent behind us, we had some very important themes put before us about radical hospitality that shouldn't just be cast aside.

I posed some questions as we began Lent that I invite you to reconsider now that we're in the season of Easter. Here they are:

- 1. What is God calling me to let go of in my life so that I may offer radical hospitality?
- 2. How can I live out love and compassion for others?
- 3. How can I nurture a spirit of radical hospitality during this season?
- 4. What significance does Christ's death and resurrection have on my understanding of radical hospitality and how do others see that in my daily living?

What has changed for you over these last several weeks as you have considered the idea of radical hospitality? Has anything? If not, why? Where and how is the Spirit nudging you to serve?

Matthew writes, "For I was hungry and you gave me nothing to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink, I was a stranger and you did not invite me in, I needed clothes and you did not clothe me, I was sick and in prison and you did not look after me.' "They also will answer, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or needing clothes or sick or in prison, and did not help you?' "He will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did not do for one of the least of these, you did not do for me.'

Let's continue to commit to living out the radical hospitality to which our risen Christ calls us.

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Easter Blessings,

John Brennan reported that many people have asked how we're doing compared to last year. While we used a lot of our savings in 2024, we're seeing good progress in 2025. So far, we're on track to cut our deficit by more than half. While we can't predict the future, Giving is up, and Expenses are about the same. We're entering spring in a strong position, with exciting events ahead for our congregation.

John Brennan recommended a change in our policy for restricted giving. Restricted giving is a great way to support causes through St. John's, such as projects for Haiti, Lutheran World Relief, and the Good Neighbor Clinic. However, John suggests we no longer accept restricted gifts for individuals. We encourage people

to still give directly to individuals, and our office can assist with these connections, but we won't act as a middleman for these gifts. If you have any questions, please contact Pastor Sally. A motion to change the policy to no longer accept restricted giving for individuals was made by James Newman and seconded by Gina Varley. Motion carried.
