The Many Loves of a Church Secretary by June Hunter

Church secretaries are loved, hated, overlooked, understood, misunderstood, overworked, competent, incompetent, long-suffering, impatient, and infinitely necessary to the daily life of the church.

They make the best cup of coffee in town, and serve it at all hours, free of charge, and they know by the sound of a voice on the telephone whether the caller is desperate or merely dramatizing. They are the minister's sounding-board, wailing wall, and nursemaid all rolled into one.

Church secretaries quickly master the art of making up an interesting Sunday bulletin when all they have to start with is the notice of the forthcoming Boy Scout paper drive. They learn to cope with salesmen, hypercritical parishioners, mischievous small boys and girls, temperamental machines, ducks and snow shovels that block the doors, and leaky toilet tanks.

They can read the minister's writing better than his wife or her husband can, and they can keep secrets. Also, they are the only ones who know where to find the new roll of adding machine tape, the movie projector, or the empty cake pan from the fellowship dinner.

Church secretaries come in assorted sizes, shapes and colors – short, tall, skinny, fat, blonde, brunette, plain, and pretty. It has sometimes happened that one has changed from fat to skinny or from blonde to gray during the course of her employment – due, no doubt, to the pressures of her work. It's more likely, however, that she would switch from skinny to fat, since there are often gifts of food sent her way.

They can paint posters, make bulletin boards, find space for two different meetings that have been scheduled for the same time slot and track down the minister during an emergency. They can come in early to open the building for a meeting or stay late to close-up.

Church secretaries spend their lunch hours at the post office buying stamps or dropping off a large mailing, buying office supplies, dropping off the bank deposit or delivering flowers and bulletins to home-bound parishioners.

They make mental notes of comments they hear regarding the Sunday sermons and tactfully relay such comments (in edited form) at the appropriate time. They accustom themselves to receive no remarks whatsoever when the bulletin is correct week after week, but to expect a half-dozen calls pointing out the occasional "boo-boo."

They learn to smile sweetly – and silently – when confronted with a six-page committee report for immediate typing and copying on the day of the regular monthly board meeting, when they know for certain that the committee met three weeks ago.

And they are very good at applying first aid and aspirin, picking out hymns for Sunday and music for funerals, listening to problems, thinking up ideas for activity groups, babysitting, fixing stubborn copiers and paper shredders, writing newsletters, standing in line at post offices, and eating lunch while answering the telephone.

Church secretaries like warm offices, electric typewriters, copy machines that don't quit on Friday mornings when the bulletin is being printed, thoughtful Lutheran Church Women hostesses who leave leftover goodies from the morning meetings, and all volunteers.

They do not like people who borrow office equipment after hours without leaving a note, washrooms in the other wing of the church, telephones that invariably ring when secretaries are in the above-mentioned washrooms, the eerie feeling of being completely alone in a large building some days and being taken for granted.

Most church secretaries like their work despite its unpredictable demands. Some feel it is a way to serve. All of them know that they could earn more if they worked in industry.

But...every once in a while, when a church secretary has been able to help someone in trouble or smooth out a potentially difficult situation, the smile she receives from the person facing her across the battered and cluttered desk makes her hectic daily routine very worthwhile indeed.

What is a church secretary? The "Martha" of the church office, that's all. But what would your church do without her?

In May 28 Circle members and one guest attended Circle meetings. The Study was led by Darlene Holl, Mary Weeks, Connie Burton and Kathy Lester. In June the Study will be led by Darlene Holl, Mary Weeks, Marian DeGiovanni and Kathy Lester.

The Sauk/Columbia County Conference (Formerly Baraboo Conference) was held on April 26th at Zion Lutheran Church, Rock Springs. Zion and St. John's in Leland (sister churches, co-hosted). There were 7 from St. John's of Prairie du Sac who attended: Marian DeGiovanni, Eunice Yanke, Kathy Lester, Ginny Nimmow, Barb Salveson, Diane Elsing and Ruth Dresser. There was a total of 40 ladies in all who attended the conference.

Lisa Carlson Pickarts gave a very interesting talk about the Good Neighbor Clinic, which was started by her father, Dr. Haakon Carlson in 1999. He had retired and wanted to keep on helping people and Dr. DeGiovanni had talked to him about helping in Haiti (where he was doing a lot of work). Dr. Carlson was seriously thinking of joining Dr. DeGiovanni and would be spending a lot of time in Haiti. Lisa's mom (Janice) didn't want him to be away from home and persuaded him to stay.... saying "there a lot of people who need you right here." So, The Good Neighbor Clinic was started right in Prairie du Sac at St. John's Lutheran Church!

Volunteers would come every week and move furniture around, papered the windows for privacy and made the rooms into a clinic. They later moved into a facility at St. Vincent's, and they are now located in the old Sauk-Prairie Hospital. The Good Neighbor Clinic is staffed by volunteer physicians, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, nurses, social workers and interpreters. They have expanded services to include a diabetes nurse-patient educator. They are supported by various organizations in the Sauk-Prairie community and by generous donations from individuals and available grants. The 3 Pharmacies have been a tremendous help also. There is a lot to it, and it takes a

lot of dedicated people...some writing grant requests...to keep it going. We can be so grateful to Dr. Carlson for starting the clinic and for all the hard-working volunteers who do so much to help the thousands of people who need this health care (uninsured or low-income people). They are always very happy and grateful for this help. Dr. Carlson would be proud that his daughter Lisa is now the Vice President of the Good Neighbor Clinic.

There was a business meeting led by Donna Peterson, WELCA Synod President. Offering Total was \$688. (Half will go to Good Neighbor Clinic and Half to WELCA Synod). We talked about what we are doing as far as quilts and kits for Lutheran World Relief also including hospice kits and newborn kits for Global Ministries. Other churches in the Conference are doing about the same things we are doing, some are making greeting cards and gifts for Care Ministry, making sani-pads for girls in Africa, and making t-shirts into diapers. One big thing for us to be thinking about: St. John's, Prairie du Sac will host the 2026 Spring Gathering, (usually the last Saturday in April). We then enjoyed a very nice luncheon consisting of chicken salad sandwiches (home-made buns), several different kinds of salads (jello, 7-layer, vegetable, macaroni) and a delicious cake for dessert.

We are urging people to attend the WELCA Synodical Biennial Convention at New Heights Church at the Grove in Mazomanie on Saturday, October 4th. Early Bird Registration is July 1-August 10. We will be getting more information about this event. We were also informed that the Triennial Convention is in Des Moines, IA, July 16-19, 2026.

Here at St. John's, we will be having our Summer Picnic on Thursday, July 17th, in the Fellowship Hall at 10:00 a.m. Ruth Circle is in charge of the brunch and will be furnishing the food and doing the serving. You can bring a guest, and you don't have to bring food! How about that? It's a good deal....so mark your calendars now....and plan to attend. We will have a speaker from ADRC. This should be very interesting!

We are working on updating the St. John's WELCA pamphlet explaining all our Circle activities and including new pictures of each Circle.

Dear Friends in Christ,

In Philippians 4:6–7, Paul writes, "Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

This time of year is often much hoped for after the long winter months. We long for the blooming flowers, the warmer temps, and the sunshine. What we don't always bargain for are the massive amounts of transitions that happen in our lives and our communities.

School ending, graduations, retirements, and moving can all cause our anxiety to increase. Not to mention the daily decisions and events that we face.

If you're feeling anxious today, take a moment to breathe, pray, and remember that God walks with you. Reach out to a trusted friend, a pastor, or a small group. Let's be a community that walks alongside one another with love and compassion.

And always remember: God's peace is greater than our fear.
