## Treasurer's Temple Talk from June 15th Worship Service

Good Morning. My name is John Brennan, and I am the elected Treasurer here for the last 7 months. If you don't know me, you probably know my parents, or maybe one of my brothers, or sisters. We all kind of work in public service around the area. My parents raised us to serve, and apparently did a very good job at it.

I just wanted to update everybody, at the half year mark, on how we are doing as a church, financially.

First off, thank you. I think I speak for everyone, staff and volunteers, when I say that. We have a thriving community, with wonderful people spreading joy and empathy, helping people and holding hands, every single day. From card playing, to quilt making, sharing meals, and teaching children, we are spreading the good word. If you aren't here during the week, I encourage you to join in. This is a wonderful community to be a part of, and we want you to join in. Time is flying, and if you don't jump on, it passes right on by. Our greatest asset, our greatest treasure, is our people.

How are we doing with our money treasure? That is the question that we get a lot! And generally, fine. Not great, not good, just about fine. We are probably in a better situation than a lot of churches in the area, but we are, just like I'd imagine many of our own finances, just...fine. We all have lived through the whirlwind of the last few years, so I don't really need to talk about how things are expensive...but I will anyway. This is a big building. Lots of expenses, all of which cost more than they did 5 years ago. This winter was pretty expensive, and really it wasn't even that bad of a winter...we spent 8k on heating, 5k on repairs on said heating, 6k on electricity, and 2k on snow removal. We spent the money that we collected for the Organ, about 19k, this year alone. I'm sure you are all seeing it at home. Times are tough.

By far our biggest expense is also our greatest strength, our people. Again, that's our treasure. What we want to do is provide our people, you and me, with something that you value. We want to make sure that when you need Sally, or Elise, or our amazing, yet unidentified future pastor, they are there. We want to create a space where when you show up, you feel like family, and that you are surrounded by people who support and feel supported. Whether it's a cup of coffee, or a gas card to help you get to work next week.

All that being said, I guess I'm supposed to ask you for money, probably. But I'd rather just continue to show you that you are valuable to us, and hopefully, we are valuable to you. If you haven't evaluated your giving in a while, I humbly ask you to take a look.

#### Dear Friends in Christ,

In the life of the Church, we often find ourselves marking time through seasons — Advent, Lent, Easter — and through the special rhythms of community life: baptisms, confirmations, weddings, funerals, and goodbyes.

In June we celebrated the retirement of Linda Hines and this month we now prepare to say goodbye to Intern Elise. Goodbyes are never easy. Whether they come with celebration or sorrow, retirement or relocation, they bring with them a mixture of gratitude and grief, joy and sadness.

As we say farewell to Intern Elise, we give thanks for her service, her presence, and the countless ways she has helped shape our congregation over the last year. We give thanks for the ways she showed up at the countless bedsides, living rooms, and nursing home services. We give thanks for the knowledge and passion she exuded as she taught about immigration, social justice, gun violence, and simply being a good neighbor. We give thanks for the shared laughter as she led worship in her light up shoes and dawned her blaze orange hunting hat. The list goes on.

Last year I listened to the book <u>How to Walk Into a Room</u>, on discernment in all areas of our lives. Author Emily Freeman describes the 'Point and Call' method used by Japanese train engineers. They point and name all the things that they see as a standardized safety metric. River crossing over a bridge? Point, and say "river crossing." Point and Call is meant to create the habit of becoming aware of our surroundings, identifying and naming, so that we can respond to hazards or blessings accordingly. Infants and toddlers do the same.

At first I was completely flummoxed about how this could be a life changing practice or a means for discernment... And then, I realized that I was pointing at things without naming or calling them. Naming and calling is to become aware of what is happening around us, to us, and through us. Becoming aware, leads to discernment, understanding what needs to happen with what we observe.

Consider these Points and Calls and their effects:

**Point**: river- **Call**: "flooded river" - **Effect**: Caution for safety(!) and glory for God's wild creation

**Point**: people - **Call**: "Congregation" - **Effect**: A sense of unity and belonging in the Christian family

**Point**: tears - **Call**: "Sadness" - **Effect**: Identify the cause of sadness, and discerning God's presence in difficulty and where the Spirit is leading your at this time

Ultimately, what we Point and Call and discern is part of understanding God's Spirit moving in our lives. We become attuned through pointing and calling things with gratitude. Or, we become attuned to pointing and calling things with discernment so that we may move through the seasons of life with the Spirit guiding us. I wonder what you will find as you Point and Call in your life, and may you observe where God's Spirit is already moving within. Amen.

Nothing we are spending is frivolous or unnecessary. We have great people doing great things.

Big Expense this month was the final payment on the organ, coming in at \$9463. This is now paid for and done. Thank goodness.

We have to decide on the CDs: Both are maturing. We do not currently have need for the cash, and with no large purchases upcoming, my advice would be to roll them over. As you can see on

your reports, currently we have about 70000 in savings. These two CDs have 125,000 in them. We could discuss changing the investment vehicle to something more flexible, Todd had some ideas. Flexibility might be nice for an incoming pastor.

Todd asked if we should consider renewing the CDs outside of Bank of Prairie du Sac if rates were higher. With John not in attendance, Nancy asked we hold that discussion for next month.

A motion to approve the financial report was made by Melani and 2nd by James. Motion carried.
