The Offering will be collected in a basket/collection container at the back of the worship space. The offering plate will not be passed. We will be carpooling, and you should let Aletha know if you plan to go. We will let you know what time to be at church to be included in the carpool.

We have chosen to give this money to 6:8 here in our own community, instead of the one they chose in Madison. Dear Friends in Christ,



Pastor Preston Fields, Campus Pastor at UW-Madison, recently wrote about campus ministry, "We're not the flashiest thing happening on campus. We don't have a worship band with smoke machines or an app that tracks your Bible reading streak...this ministry is quieter than that. Slower. More human. The loudness isn't in volume. It's in presence. It's the kind of loud that holds your hand through grief. The kind that remembers your name and your dog's name and asks how your exam went."

I often hear the longing of our adult members to have more connection with our youth. To see them here in the building and participating in a lot of the same rituals and traditions as when we were young. Things are simply not the same for our students.

Expectations of involvement in activities, clubs, and sports are higher than ever. Wednesday nights and Sunday mornings are not left for churches (though I must share our district is INCREDIBLE at honoring Wednesday nights). Life goes at a dizzying speed. **But**...

That doesn't mean our students aren't engaging in their faith or at church. We just need to know where to find them and how to engage with them. Here are some ideas for you!

Our children are here between services in Sunday School. Volunteer to read to them at library time. Put your name down as a substitute. Simply walk down the hall just before pick up (10:15) and introduce yourself to their parents. Our teens are here on Wednesday nights. Volunteer to set up, serve, and/or clean up the meal. You eat for free as a volunteer and you get a chance to meet our youth. Also, they serve in many roles on Sundays. Seek them out!

They're also out in the community serving through 6:8, playing sports and performing and using their minds and their skills to better this earth. They're passionate for justice and helping others. Go find them – check out the school activities calendar and show up at their events!

Sometimes it is just as simple as finding out their dog's names. If we get stuck in the mindset that they have to come to us we'll miss them every time. But when we go to them we can create some awesome relationships.
