What is your favorite part of summer?

Mine has changed over the years. When I was a kid, being off from school was the first and best part of summer. The long days to play outside with all the neighborhood friends, camping on weekends, the Fourth of July, maybe getting into a little bit of trouble, picnics with family—the list was long.

I guess my list is long now, too, but it's a bit different—maybe a bit simpler. The longer days are still high on my list, but I have to tell you, the lush green of Wisconsin is right up there at the top. I have long ago given up many of my outdoor winter hobbies, and the short winter days tend to dampen my spirits. But the color green in the summer seems to give me an extra step in my day; it brings me hope.

In the church, you will notice the pastors wearing green stoles, and the paraments are all green as well. We move to the color green after Pentecost. The color green represents spiritual growth—a time for Christians to deepen their faith and discipleship; life and renewal—reflecting the ongoing life of the Church; and hope and vitality—God's work continuing in everyday life.

I will tell you that I didn't know any of this when my appreciation for summer's life-giving green first took root. But in hindsight, it all makes sense.

This season after Pentecost—this long stretch of “green time”—is not flashy. It doesn't come with the drama of Christmas or Easter. Instead, it invites us into steady growth. Like the fields and trees around us, faith doesn't usually grow all at once. It deepens quietly, day by day, nourished by Word, community, and grace.

As you enjoy the beauty of this summer season, I invite you to see that green not just as scenery, but as a reminder. A reminder that God is still at work. A reminder that growth is happening, even when it feels slow or unseen. A reminder that new life, hope, and renewal are not just ideas—but promises we live into every day.

May this green season fill you with renewed energy, deeper faith, and a quiet confidence that God is growing something good in you.

In May, 24 women attended Circle meetings, where Bible studies were led by Darlene Holl, Mary Weeks, Marian DeGiovanni, and Kathy Lester. The same leaders will continue in June as the groups begin a three-part study titled "I Am Worthy."

The WELCA Sauk/Columbia Conference, held April 25, drew 37 women from several area churches. Marian DeGiovanni welcomed attendees and honored Eunice Yankee, a longtime WELCA member who passed away in March. The gathering included worship, singing, devotions based on Micah 6:8, and encouragement to attend the 2026 WELCA Gathering in Des Moines.

The keynote speaker was John Ramthun, co-founder of the Christian nonprofit 6:8, which focuses on serving communities through justice, mercy, and humble living. He explained how the organization supports people through programs that restore dignity, provide poverty assistance, job training, youth programs, food support, tutoring, and mission work. The organization also operates a café that helps fund its mission and provides second chances for individuals and families.

Attendees were impressed by the impact of 6:8 and encouraged to continue supporting its work. The conference offering totaled \$808, split between 6:8 and the WELCA South Central Wisconsin Synodical Organization. After the meeting, guests enjoyed a lunch prepared by Donna and volunteers.

Looking ahead, the church will host an All-Circle Picnic on July 23 in the Fellowship Hall. Preparations are also underway for Lutheran World Relief kits and quilts, with each Circle responsible for different types of kits. The deadline for having our Lutheran World Relief kits and quilts ready for shipment will be in September. Thrivent grants will help cover expenses, and the quilting group has been working diligently throughout the year. Lydia Circle has been visiting Special Friends during April and May, while Ruth Circle will continue visiting them in June and July.
